At the end of subtitle D of title VII of Division A, add the following:

1	SEC. 746. PROCESS FOR IDENTIFYING VETERANS USING CI-

4	LATED TO TOXIC EXPOSURE.
5	(a) Development of Process to Identify Vet-
6	ERANS.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs, in coopera-
7	tion with the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of
8	Health and Human Services, shall develop a process for
9	identifying veterans using civilian treatment facilities in
10	order to identify conditions that may be related to expo-
11	sure of the veteran to toxic substances while serving in
12	the Armed Forces.
13	(b) Online Portal for Identification of Symp-
14	TOMS.—
15	(1) In general.—Not later than one year
16	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
17	retary of Veterans Affairs, the Secretary of Defense,
18	and the Secretary of Health and Human Services

1	shall jointly develop a uniform online portal for the
2	purpose of identifying symptoms linked to diseases
3	that may be unique to service in the Armed Forces.
4	(2) Elements of Portal.—The portal devel-
5	oped under paragraph (1)—
6	(A) shall be free to use by health care pro-
7	viders; and
8	(B) shall not require the entry of person-
9	ally identifiable information.
10	(c) Briefing by Secretary of Defense.—The
11	Secretary of Defense shall ensure that members of the
12	Armed Fores separating from active duty are briefed on
13	the need to identify that they served in the Armed Forces
14	when visiting a civilian health care provider.
15	(d) INQUIRY REGARDING MILITARY SERVICE.—The
16	Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall require that any health
17	care provider that provides health care under the laws ad-
18	ministered by the Secretary inquire about whether any pa-
19	tient seen by the health care provider served in the Armed
20	Forces upon intake of the patient.
21	(e) Report.—Not later than 180 days after the date
22	of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans
23	Affairs, the Secretary of Defense, and the Secretary of
24	Health and Human Services shall submit to Congress a
