

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 8038**  
**OFFERED BY MR. GIMENEZ OF FLORIDA**

At the end of division C, add the following:

1 **SEC. \_\_\_\_.** **INCLUSION OF INFORMATION ON EMERGING**  
2 **TECHNOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENTS IN AN-**  
3 **NUAL CHINA MILITARY POWER REPORT.**

4 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—As part of each annual report  
5 submitted under section 1202 of the National Defense Au-  
6 thorization Act for Fiscal Year 2000 (Public Law 106–  
7 65; 10 U.S.C. 113 note)(commonly referred to as the  
8 “China Military Power report”), the Secretary of Defense  
9 and Secretary of State, in consultation with the heads of  
10 such other Federal departments and agencies as the Sec-  
11 retary of Defense and Secretary of State may determine  
12 appropriate, shall include a component on emerging tech-  
13 nological developments involving the People’s Republic of  
14 China.

15 (b) **MATTERS.**—Each report component referred to  
16 in subsection (a) shall include an identification and assess-  
17 ment of at least five fields of critical or emerging tech-  
18 nologies in which the People’s Liberation Army is in-  
19 vested, or for which there are Military-Civil Fusion Devel-

1 opment Strategy programs of the People's Republic of  
2 China, including the following:

3 (1) A brief summary of each such identified  
4 field and its relevance to the military power and na-  
5 tional security of the People's Republic of China.

6 (2) The implications for the national security of  
7 the United States as a result of the leadership or  
8 dominance by the People's Republic of China in each  
9 such identified field and associated supply chains.

10 (3) The identification of at least 10 entities  
11 domiciled in, controlled by, or directed by the Peo-  
12 ple's Republic of China (including any subsidiaries  
13 of such entity), involved in each such identified field,  
14 and an assessment of, with respect to each such en-  
15 tity, the following:

16 (A) Whether the entity has procured com-  
17 ponents from any known United States sup-  
18 pliers.

19 (B) Whether any United States technology  
20 imported by the entity is controlled under  
21 United States regulations.

22 (C) Whether United States capital is in-  
23 vested in the entity, either through known di-  
24 rect investment or passive investment flows.

1 (D) Whether the entity has any connection  
2 to the People’s Liberation Army, the Military-  
3 Civil Fusion program of the People’s Republic  
4 of China, or any other state-sponsored initia-  
5 tives of the People’s Republic of China to sup-  
6 port the development of national champions.

7 (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-  
8 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congres-  
9 sional committees” means—

10 (1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the  
11 House of Representatives;

12 (2) the Committee on Armed Services of the  
13 House of Representatives;

14 (3) the Committee on Foreign Relations of the  
15 Senate; and

16 (4) the Committee on Armed Services of the  
17 Senate.
