6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the 7 date of the enactment of this section, the Secretary of 8 Homeland Security shall enhance border security efforts 9 to disrupt the smuggling of United States-sourced fire-10 arms and related munitions across the land border with 11 Mexico by taking the following actions:

12 (1) Increasing collaboration, including joint op-13 erations, between U.S. Customs and Border Protec-14 tion, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, 15 and other appropriate Federal partners to identify, 16 target, disrupt, and dismantle transnational criminal 17 organizations responsible for exporting firearms and 18 related munitions from the United States to Mexico. 19 (2) Directing Homeland Security Investigations 20 of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement to $\mathbf{2}$

establish a mechanism for sharing aggregated infor mation about the interdiction of firearms by law en forcement agents and officers of the Department in
 the United States and the interdiction of United
 States-sourced firearms in Mexico with Federal part ners.

7 (3) Expanding efforts within Homeland Secu8 rity Investigations of U.S. Immigration and Customs
9 Enforcement to collect information concerning fire10 arms recovered at crime scenes in Mexico and ana11 lyze such information for leads regarding United
12 States sources in order to disrupt cross-border fire13 arms smuggling.

(4) Enhancing Department of Homeland Security coordination with appropriate Mexican Government agencies to increase outbound inspections by
U.S. Customs and Border Protection on the land
border with Mexico.

(5) Establishing performance measures, in consultation with appropriate Federal partners, for efforts to disrupt the smuggling of United Statessourced firearms across the land border with Mexico.
(b) REPORTING.—Not later than one year after the
date of the enactment of this section and annually thereafter, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall submit to

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the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of
 Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security
 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a report on the
 implementation of subsection (a). Each such report shall
 include information relating to the following:

- 6 (1) Ongoing, planned, and completed activities7 related to such implementation.
