

**AMENDMENT TO RULES**  
**COMMITTEE PRINT 119–8**  
**OFFERED BY MR. GOLDMAN OF NEW YORK**

At the end of subtitle B of title XVI, insert the following new section:

**1 SEC. 16\_\_\_\_. REPORT ON RUSSIAN ACTIVE MEASURES IN**  
**2 NATO TERRITORY.**

**3 (a) IN GENERAL.**—Not later than 120 days after the  
**4 date of the enactment of this Act, the Director of National**  
**5 Intelligence, in coordination with the Secretary of Defense**  
**6 and the Secretary of State, shall submit to the appropriate**  
**7 congressional committees a report that includes—**

**8 (1) an assessment of the extent of Russia’s ac-**  
**9 tive measures against NATO allies and partners,**  
**10 specifically with regard to industrial, commercial,**  
**11 and military sabotage;**

**12 (2) a detailed description of Russia’s recruit-**  
**13 ment methods of agents in NATO countries, such as**  
**14 blackmail, bribery, and threats of harm;**

**15 (3) a threat assessment of these actions toward**  
**16 U.S. and NATO bases and infrastructure; and**

1           (4) an assessment of the extent of direct in-  
2           volvement by the Russian intelligence services in  
3           these operations.

4           (b) FORM.—The report required by subsection (a)  
5           shall be submitted in an unclassified form, but portions  
6           of the report may contain a classified annex, so long as  
7           such annex is provided separately from the unclassified re-  
8           port.

9           (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-  
10          FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congres-  
11          sional committees” means—

12           (1) the Committee on Armed Services, the  
13           Committee on Foreign Affairs, the Permanent Select  
14           Committee On Intelligence, the Committee on Ap-  
15           propriations, and the Committee on Homeland Secu-  
16           rity of the House of Representatives; and

17           (2) the Committee on Armed Services, the  
18           Committee on Foreign Relations, the Select Com-  
19           mittee on Intelligence, the Committee on Appropria-  
20           tions, and the Committee on Homeland Security and  
21           Governmental Affairs of the Senate.
