

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 119–8
OFFERED BY MR. GOLDMAN OF NEW YORK

At the end of subtitle B of title XVII, add the following:

1 SEC. 17__ . REPORT ON SECURITY RISKS POSED BY TUR-
2 KEY'S OCCUPATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF CY-
3 PRUS.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
5 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of De-
6 fense, in consultation with the Secretary of Homeland Se-
7 curity and the Director of National Intelligence, shall sub-
8 mit to the appropriate congressional committees a report
9 that includes a description of each of the following:

10 (1) The security risks posed to the United
11 States, its allies and partners, including Israel, the
12 United Kingdom, Greece, and the Republic of Cy-
13 prus, as a result of the Republic of Turkey's occupa-
14 tion of the Republic of Cyprus.

15 (2) The presence, both verified and estimated,
16 of groups designated by the United States Depart-
17 ment of State as Foreign Terrorist Organizations,
18 including Hamas, Hezbollah, and the Islamic Revo-
19 lutionary Guard Corps in areas of the Republic of

1 Cyprus under the occupation by the Republic of
2 Turkey.

3 (3) A chronological review of terrorist attacks
4 committed, or attempted, in the Republic of Cyprus
5 or the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and
6 Dhekelia which were organized, planned, or other-
7 wise facilitated in the area of the Republic of Cyprus
8 under occupation by the Republic of Turkey.

9 (4) A vulnerability assessment to attacks by
10 any such group on U.S. troops, U.S. assets, or U.S.
11 facilities located in the Republic of Cyprus or the
12 Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia.

13 (5) The extent to which the Republic of Turkey
14 contributed to, or enabled, acts of terrorism from
15 being committed, or attempted, in Republic of Cy-
16 prus or the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and
17 Dhekelia, including by providing groups defined as a
18 Foreign Terrorist Organization by the United States
19 with access to the area of the Republic of Cyprus
20 under occupation by the Republic of Turkey and ad-
21 ministered by Turkey.

22 (6) The extent of the Republic of Turkey's on-
23 going political, logistical, and financial support of
24 Hamas and other groups defined as a designated
25 terrorist organization by the United States, includ-

1 ing through financial institutions located in the area
2 of the Republic of Cyprus under occupation by the
3 Republic of Turkey, contributes to acts of terrorism
4 committed, or attempted, by these terrorist groups
5 within the Republic of Cyprus or the Sovereign Base
6 Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia.

7 (7) The extent to which the Republic of Tur-
8 key's continued use of U.S. arms to facilitate the oc-
9 cupation of the Republic of Cyprus enabled acts of
10 terror from being committed, or attempted, within
11 the area of the Republic of Cyprus or the Sovereign
12 Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia.

13 (8) Any effective steps the Republic of Turkey
14 has taken to counter acts of terror from being com-
15 mitted, or attempted, within the area of the Repub-
16 lic of Cyprus or the Sovereign Base Areas of
17 Akrotiri and Dhekelia.

18 (b) FORM.—The report required by subsection (a)
19 shall be submitted in an unclassified form, but portions
20 of the report may contain a classified annex, so long as
21 such annex is provided separately from the unclassified re-
22 port.

23 (c) BRIEFING.—Upon completion of the report re-
24 quired by subsection (a), the Secretary of Defense, in co-
25 ordination with the Secretary of Homeland Security and

1 the Director of National Intelligence, shall brief the appro-
2 priate congressional committees on the report.

3 (d) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES
4 DEFINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate con-
5 gressional committee” means—

6 (1) the Committee on Armed Services, the
7 Committee on Homeland Security, the Committee on
8 Foreign Affairs, and the Permanent Select Com-
9 mittee on Intelligence of the House of Representa-
10 tives; and

11 (2) the Committee on Armed Services, the
12 Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental
13 Affairs, the Committee on Foreign Relations, and
14 the Select Committee on Intelligence of the Senate.
