OFFERED BY MR. GOSAR OF ARIZONA

Strike section 4 and insert the following:

1	SEC. 4. ESTABLISHMENT OF BORDER SECURITY
2	VERIFICATION COMMISSION.
3	(a) IN GENERAL.—There is established a Border Se
4	curity Verification Commission (in this Act referred to as
5	the "BSVC").
6	(b) Purpose.—The BSVC shall certify the accuracy
7	of the notifications regarding situational awareness and
8	operational control required from the Secretary pursuant
9	to section 3(n).
10	(c) Composition.—
11	(1) Members.—The BSVC shall be composed
12	of 16 members of whom—
13	(A) 3 shall be appointed by the President
14	of the United States;
15	(B) 2 shall be appointed by the Speaker of
16	the House of Representatives;
17	(C) 1 shall be appointed by the Minority
18	Leader of the House of Representatives;

1	(D) 2 shall be appointed by the Majority
2	Leader of the Senate;
3	(E) 1 shall be appointed by the Minority
4	Leader of the Senate;
5	(F) 1 shall be appointed by the Secretary
6	of Defense;
7	(G) 1 shall be appointed by the Secretary
8	of State;
9	(H) 1 shall be appointed by the Secretary
10	of Homeland Security;
11	(I) 1 shall be appointed by the Governor of
12	Arizona;
13	(J) 1 shall be appointed by the Governor
14	of California;
15	(K) 1 shall be appointed by the Governor
16	of New Mexico; and
17	(L) 1 shall be appointed by the Governor
18	of Texas.
19	(2) Qualifications.—
20	(A) In General.—The members of the
21	BSVC shall include individuals with State or
22	national recognition for their expertise in immi-
23	gration policy, security policy, border enforce-
24	ment, law enforcement, immigration law, crimi-
25	nal law, or other similar areas.

1	(B) Inclusion.—The members of the
2	BSVC shall include at least one member from
3	each specified area of expertise listed in sub-
4	paragraph (A), except that no member of the
5	BSVC shall be a current Federal employee or
6	current Member of Congress.
7	(3) Deadline for appointment.—Each
8	member of the BSVC shall be appointed by not later
9	than 60 days after the date of the enactment of this
10	Act.
11	(d) Removal.—Any member of the BSVC may be
12	removed by the President or by resolution of Congress for
13	neglect of duty or malfeasance in office, but for no other
14	cause.
15	(e) Vacancies; Rules; Quorum; Chairperson;
16	VICE CHAIRPERSON; VOTING.—
17	(1) Vacancies.—No vacancy on the BSVC
18	shall impair the right of the remaining members to
19	exercise all the powers of the BSVC. Any vacancy in
20	the membership of the BSVC shall be filled within
21	60 days and in the same manner as the original ap-
22	pointment.
23	(2) Rules.—The BSVC may establish by ma-
24	jority vote any other rules for the conduct of busi-
25	ness, if such rules are not inconsistent with this Act.

1	(3) QUORUM.—A majority of members of the
2	BSVC shall constitute a quorum to conduct busi-
3	ness, but the BSVC may establish a lesser quorum
4	for conducting hearings scheduled by the BSVC.
5	(4) Chairperson.—The Chairperson shall be
6	the head of a national laboratory within the Depart-
7	ment of Homeland Security laboratory network with
8	prior expertise in border security, appointed by the
9	President, in coordination with the Speaker and mi-
10	nority leader of the House of Representatives and
11	the majority and minority leaders of the Senate.
12	(5) VICE CHAIRPERSON.—The Vice Chair shall
13	be one of the two appointees chosen by the Speaker
14	of the House, and the Vice Chair shall act as Chair-
15	person in the absence or disability of the Chair-
16	person or in case of a vacancy in the office of the
17	Chairperson.
18	(6) Voting on proposals.—Any proposal of
19	the BSVC must be approved by the majority of ap-
20	pointed members present.
21	(7) TIE VOTE.—In the event of a tie vote of the
22	BSVC, the Chairperson (or, in the absence of the
23	Chairperson, the Vice Chair) vote shall cast the de-
24	ciding vote.
25	(f) Powers.—

1	(1) Meetings.—The BSVC shall meet on the
2	call of the chairperson. The BSVC shall meet and
3	begin operations not later than 180 days after the
4	date of the enactment of this Act.
5	(2) Rules.—The BSVC may establish by ma-
6	jority vote any other rules for the conduct of busi-
7	ness, if such rules are not inconsistent with this Act.
8	(3) Public Hearings.—
9	(A) IN GENERAL.—The BSVC shall hold
10	not fewer than two public hearings during each
11	calendar year.
12	(B) WITNESS TESTIMONY.—In holding the
13	hearings required under subparagraph (A), the
14	BSVC shall request the public testimony of
15	Federal, State, and local officials, and any pri-
16	vate citizen or organization the BSVC deter-
17	mines is relevant to carrying out its mission.
18	(4) Authority to inform research prior-
19	ITIES FOR DATA COLLECTION.—The BSVC may ad-
20	vise the Administration and Congress, simulta-
21	neously, on priorities for efficient data collection on
22	border enforcement so that operations may be im-
23	proved prior to legal adoption of full report on
24	BSVC recommendations.

1	(5) Security Clearances.—A member or em-
2	ployee of the BSVC shall receive an appropriate se-
3	curity clearance, as determined by the BSVC in con-
4	sultation with the Secretary of Homeland Security
5	that is commensurate with the sensitivity of the clas-
6	sified information to which such member or em-
7	ployee will be given access by reason of membership
8	in or employment by the BSVC.
9	(6) OBTAINING OFFICIAL DATA.—The BSVC
10	may secure directly from any department or agency
11	of the United States information necessary to enable
12	it to carry out this section. Upon request of the
13	Chairperson, the head of that department or agency
14	shall furnish that information to the BSVC on an
15	agreed upon schedule.
16	(7) Postal services.—The BSVC may use
17	the United States mails in the same manner and
18	under the same conditions as other departments and
19	agencies of the Federal Government.
20	(8) GIFTS.—The BSVC may not accept, use
21	and dispose of gifts or donations of services or prop-
22	erty.
23	(9) Office space and assistance.—Upon
24	the request of the BSVC, the Secretary of Homeland

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1	Security shall provide reasonable and appropriate of-
2	fice space, supplies, and administrative assistance.
3	(g) Personnel Matters.—
4	(1) Prohibition on compensation.—Mem-
5	bers of the BSVC may not receive pay, allowances,
6	or benefits from the Federal Government by reason
7	of their service on the BSVC.
8	(2) Travel expenses.—The members of the
9	BSVC shall be allowed travel expenses, including per
10	diem in lieu of subsistence, at rates authorized for
11	employees of agencies under subchapter I of chapter
12	57 of title 5, United States Code, while away from
13	their homes or regular places of business in the per-
14	formance of services for the BSVC.
15	(3) Detail of Federal Employees.—With
16	the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of
17	the BSVC, any Federal Government employee, with
18	the approval of the head of the appropriate Federal
19	agency or congressional office, may be detailed to
20	the BSVC without reimbursement, and such detail
21	shall be without interruption or loss of civil service
22	status, salary, benefits, or privileges.

- 1 (h) TERMINATION.—The BSVC shall terminate after
- 2 determining the accuracy of the seventh annual metrics
- 3 submission required under subsection (n)(2) of section 3.
