## AMENDMENT TO

## Rules Committee Print 118–10 Offered by Mr. Gosar of Arizona

At the end of subtitle C of title XVIII, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 18 SENSE OF CONGRESS RELATING TO RADIATION
2	EXPOSURE COMPENSATION FOR CERTAIN
3	PORTIONS OF MOHAVE COUNTY, ARIZONA.
4	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:
5	(1) From $1945$ to $1962$ , the Federal Govern-
6	ment conducted nearly 200 atmospheric weapons de-
7	velopment tests as part of the Cold War security
8	strategy of the United States, during an era when
9	hostile foreign governments were also engaged in nu-
10	clear weapons testing and proliferation. Such tests
11	exposed thousands of innocent Americans to cancer-
12	causing ionized radiation from nuclear fallout.
13	(2) When the injuries resulting from such expo-
14	sures were discovered, Congress subsequently pro-
15	vided an apology on behalf of the Federal Govern-
16	ment and the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act
17	of 1990 (Public Law 101–426; 42 U.S.C. 2210
18	note) was enacted to establish a trust fund for par-

1 tial restitution to individuals (commonly referred to 2 "Downwinders") who have contracted certain as 3 cancers and other serious diseases that may be di-4 rectly attributed to the radiation exposure from the 5 nuclear weapons testing described in paragraph (1). 6 (3) In 2000, the Radiation Exposure Com-7 pensation Act Amendments of 2000 (Public Law 8 106-245;42U.S.C. 2210 note) was enacted, 9 amending the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act 10 of 1990. The House of Representatives stated in the 11 report accompanying such Act that the goal of Con-12 gress in amending the Radiation Exposure Com-13 pensation Act of 1990 was to "increase" the existing 14 Downwinder areas to "include" additional areas. 15 (4) Specifically, Congress added new counties to 16 the affected area pursuant to the Radiation Expo-17 sure Compensation Act Amendments of 2000, but in 18 doing so, inadvertently eliminated a portion of Mo-19 have County, Arizona, that is north of the Grand 20 Canyon and that had been included in the original 21 Radiation Exposure Compensation Act of 1990.

(5) Such elimination was the result of a drafting error in the statutory text, at odds with the stated goal of the amendment, as specified in such accompanying report.

(b) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con gress that Congress and the Federal Government have a
responsibility to provide compensation for all individuals
that developed radiation-induced cancer from the tests de scribed in subsection (a)(1).
