## Amendment to the Rules Committee Print for H.R. 4435 Offered by Mr. Gosar of Arizona

At the end of subtitle B of title XVIII, add the following new section:

## 1 SEC. 2817. REAL PROPERTY INVENTORY.

(a) INVENTORY.—The Secretary of Defense, in con3 sultation with other appropriate Federal agency officials,
4 shall develop and maintain a current, accurate, interoper5 able cadastral geographic information systems-based in6 ventory of Department of Defense buildings, land, and
7 other real property assets.

8 (b) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out this section, the9 Secretary shall—

(1) participate, pursuant to section 216 of the
E-Government Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–347;
44 U.S.C. 3501 note) in the establishment of such
standards and common protocols as are necessary to
assure the interoperability of geospatial information
pertaining to the cadastre for all users of such information;

7 (d) PUBLIC ACCESSIBILITY.—The Secretary shall 8 make the cadastre referred to in this section publicly avail-9 able on the Internet in a graphically geo-enabled and 10 searchable format, except that the Secretary, in consultation with the Secretary of Homeland Security, shall pre-11 12 vent the disclosure of any parcel or parcels of land, and 13 buildings or facilities thereon, or information related thereto, if such disclosure would impair or jeopardize the 14 15 national security or homeland defense of the United 16 States.

(e) CONSOLIDATION AND REPORT.—Not later than
180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the
19 Secretary shall submit to the Committees on Armed Serv20 ices of the House of Representatives and the Senate a re21 port on—

(1) the existing real property inventories or any
components of any cadastre currently authorized by
law or conducted by the Department of Defense, the
statutory authorization for such inventories or com-

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ponents, and the amount expended by the Federal
 Government for each such activity in fiscal year
 2014;

4 (2) the existing real property inventories or any
5 components of any cadastre currently authorized by
6 law or conducted by the Department of Defense that
7 will be eliminated or consolidated into the multipur8 pose cadastre authorized by this section;

9 (3) the existing real property inventories or any 10 components of a cadastre currently authorized by 11 law or conducted by the Department of Defense that 12 will not be eliminated or consolidated into the multi-13 purpose cadastre authorized by this Act, together 14 with a justification for not terminating or consoli-15 dating such inventories or components in the multi-16 purpose cadastre authorized by this section; and

17 (4) the cost-savings that will be achieved by 18 eliminating or consolidating duplicative or unneeded 19 real property inventories or any components of a ca-20 dastre currently authorized by law or conducted by 21 the Department of Defense that will become part of 22 the multipurpose cadastre authorized by this section. 23 (f) OFFSET.—Notwithstanding the amounts set forth 24 in the funding tables in division D, the amount authorized 25 to be appropriated in section 1402 for chemical agents and 1 munitions destruction, defense, as specified in the cor-

2 responding funding table in section 4501, for research, de-

3 velopment, test, and evaluation, is hereby reduced by

4 \$60,000,000.

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
