At the end of title V, insert the following:

1	SECTION AVIATION MAINTENANCE WORKFORCE DE-
2	VELOPMENT PILOT PROGRAM.
3	(a) In General.—The Administrator of the Federal
4	Aviation Administration may carry out a pilot program to
5	provide grants for eligible projects to support the edu-
6	cation and recruitment of aviation maintenance technical
7	workers and the development of the aviation maintenance
8	industry workforce.
9	(b) Project Grants.—
10	(1) In general.—There are authorized to be
11	appropriated \$5,000,000 for each of the fiscal years
12	2019 through 2023 to provide grants under the pilot
13	program established under subsection (a).
14	(2) Dollar amount limit.—Not more than
15	\$500,000 shall be made available for any one-time
16	grant in any fiscal year under the pilot program es-
17	tablished under subsection (a).
18	(c) Eligible Applications.—An application for a
19	grant under the pilot program established under sub-
20	section (a) shall be submitted, in such form as the com-

1	mittee established under subsection (e) may specify, joint-
2	ly by—
3	(1) a holder of a certificate issued under part
4	21, 121, 135, or 145 of title 14, Code of Federal
5	Regulations, or a labor organization representing
6	aviation maintenance workers;
7	(2) an accredited institution of higher education
8	(as defined in section 101 of the Higher Education
9	Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001));
10	(3) a State or local governmental entity; and
11	(4) a secondary school (as such term is defined
12	in section 8101 of the Elementary and Secondary
13	Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801)) that deliv-
14	ers an occupation-specific curriculum that provides
15	students with the relevant technical knowledge and
16	skills to prepare for further education and careers in
17	aviation maintenance.
18	(d) Eligible Projects.—For purposes of the pilot
19	program established under subsection (a), an eligible
20	project is a project—
21	(1) to establish new educational programs that
22	teach technical skills used in aviation maintenance,
23	including purchasing equipment, or to improve exist-
24	ing such programs;

1	(2) to establish scholarships or apprenticeships
2	for individuals pursuing employment in the aviation
3	maintenance industry, including obtaining airframe
4	and powerplant mechanic certificates;
5	(3) to support outreach about careers in the
6	aviation maintenance industry to—
7	(A) primary, secondary, and post-sec-
8	ondary school students; or
9	(B) to communities underrepresented in
10	the industry;
11	(4) to support educational opportunities related
12	to aviation maintenance in economically disadvan-
13	taged geographic areas;
14	(5) to support transition to careers in aviation
15	maintenance, including for members of the Armed
16	Forces; or
17	(6) to otherwise enhance aviation maintenance
18	technical education or the aviation maintenance in-
19	dustry workforce, as determined by a unanimous
20	vote of the committee established under subsection
21	(e).
22	(e) Grant Application Review.—
23	(1) Review committee.—The Administrator
24	shall establish a committee to review and select ap-

1	plications for grants under the pilot program estab-
2	lished under subsection (a).
3	(2) Membership.—
4	(A) In General.—The committee estab-
5	lished under paragraph (1) shall be comprised
6	of—
7	(i) representatives of aircraft repair
8	stations, air carriers, design and produc-
9	tion approval holders, labor organizations,
10	business aviation, general aviation, edu-
11	cational institutions, and other relevant
12	sectors; or
13	(ii) representatives of recognized in-
14	dustry groups representing entities de-
15	scribed in clause (i).
16	(B) Limitation.—The committee estab-
17	lished under paragraph (1) shall have not more
18	than 9 members.
