## AMENDMENT TO THE RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 116-57

## OFFERED BY MR. GRAVES OF LOUISIANA

In subtitle B of title V, add at the end the following:

1	SEC NATIONAL GUARD SUPPORT TO MAJOR DISAS-
2	TERS.
3	(a) In General.—Section 502(f) of title 32, United
4	States Code, is amended—
5	(1) in paragraph (2), by adding at the end the
6	following:
7	"(C) Operations or missions authorized by the
8	President or the Secretary of Defense to support
9	large scale, complex, catastrophic disasters, as de-
10	fined by section 311(3) of title 6, United States
11	Code, at the request of a State governor."; and
12	(2) by adding at the end the following:
13	"(4) With respect to operations or missions de-
14	scribed under paragraph (2)(C), there is authorized
15	to be appropriated to the Secretary of Defense such
16	sums as may be necessary to carry out such oper-
17	ations and missions, but only if—
18	"(A) an emergency has been declared by
19	the governor of the applicable State; and

1	"(B) the President has declared the emer-
2	gency to be a major disaster for the purposes
3	of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and
4	Emergency Assistance Act.".
5	(b) Report on Methods to Enhance Domestic
6	RESPONSE TO LARGE SCALE, COMPLEX AND CATA-
7	STROPHIC DISASTERS.—
8	(1) In general.—Not later than 180 days
9	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
10	retary of Defense, in consultation and coordination
11	with the Federal Emergency Management Agency,
12	the National Security Council, the Council of Gov-
13	ernors, and the National Governors Association,
14	shall submit to the congressional defense, the Com-
15	mittees on Transportation and Infrastructure and
16	Homeland Security of the House of Representatives,
17	and the Committee on Homeland Security and Gov-
18	ernmental Affairs of the Senate a report on their
19	plan to establish policy and processes to implement
20	the authority provided by the amendments made by
21	section 520. The report shall include a detailed ex-
22	amination of the policy framework consistent with
23	existing authorities, identify major statutory or pol-
24	icy impediments to implementation, and make rec-
25	ommendations for legislation as appropriate.

1	(2) Contents.—The report submitted under
2	paragraph (1) shall include a description of—
3	(A) the current policy and processes where-
4	by governors can request activation of the Na-
5	tional Guard under title 32, United States
6	Code, as part of the response to large scale,
7	complex, catastrophic disasters that are sup-
8	ported by the Federal Government and, if no
9	formal process exists in policy, the Secretary of
10	Defense shall provide a timeline and plan to es-
11	tablish such a policy, including consultation
12	with the Council of Governors and the National
13	Governors Association;
14	(B) the Secretary of Defense's assessment,
15	informed by consultation with the Federal
16	Emergency Management Agency, the National
17	Security Council, the Council of Governors, and
18	the National Governors Association, regarding
19	the sufficiency of current authorities for the re-
20	imbursement of National Guard and Reserve
21	manpower during large scale, complex, cata-
22	strophic disasters under title 10 and title 32,
23	United States Code, and specifically whether re-
24	imbursement authorities are sufficient to ensure
25	that military training and readiness are not de-

1	graded to fund disaster response, or invoking
2	them degrades the effectiveness of the Disaster
3	Relief Fund;
4	(C) the Department of Defense's plan to
5	ensure there is parallel and consistent policy in
6	the application of the authorities granted under
7	section 12304a of title 10, United States Code,
8	and section 502(f) of title 32, United States
9	Code, including—
10	(i) a description of the disparities be-
11	tween benefits and protections under Fed-
12	eral law versus State active duty;
13	(ii) recommended solutions to achieve
14	parity at the Federal level; and
15	(iii) recommended changes at the
16	State level, if appropriate;
17	(D) the Department of Defense's plan to
18	ensure there is parity of benefits and protec-
19	tions for military members employed as part of
20	the response to large scale, complex, cata-
21	strophic disasters under title 32 or title 10,
22	United States Code, and recommendations for
23	addressing shortfalls; and
24	(E) a review, by the Federal Emergency
25	Management Agency, of the current policy for,

and an assessment of the sufficiency of, reimbursement authority for the use of all National
Guard and Reserve, both to the Department of
Defense and to the States, during large scale,
complex, catastrophic disasters, including any
policy and legal limitations, and cost assessment impact on Federal funding.
