

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 119–8
OFFERED BY MS. GREENE OF GEORGIA

Add at the end of subtitle A of title XVII of division
A the following:

1 SEC. 1703. PUBLICATION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HOME-
2 LAND SECURITY OF THE NUMBER OF SPE-
3 CIAL INTEREST ALIENS ENCOUNTERED.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than the seventh day of
5 each month beginning with the first full month that begins
6 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
7 of Homeland Security shall publish on a publicly available
8 webpage of the Department of Homeland Security and
9 submit to the Committee on Homeland Security of the
10 House of Representatives and the Committee on Home-
11 land Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a
12 report on the total number, and an identification of the
13 nationalities or countries of last habitual residence, of spe-
14 cial interest aliens encountered by the Department during
15 the immediately preceding month. Each such report shall
16 also include the following:

17 (1) Such number disaggregated by geographic
18 regions of such encounters.

1 (2) Specifications relating to whether such en-
2 counters were made at land, air, or sea ports of
3 entry, between ports of entry, or in the interior of
4 the United States.

5 (3) Identification of any such nationalities or
6 countries of last habitual residence that are covered
7 nations.

8 (b) INCLUSION.—The first report required under sub-
9 section (a) shall also include the matters described in such
10 subsection for the time period from January 20, 2021,
11 through January 19, 2025.

12 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

13 (1) ALIEN.—The term “alien” has the meaning
14 given such term in section 101 of the Immigration
15 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101).

16 (2) COVERED NATION.—The term “covered na-
17 tion” has the meaning given such term in section
18 4872(f)(2) of title 10, United States Code.

19 (3) SPECIAL INTEREST ALIEN.—The term “spe-
20 cial interest alien” means an alien who, based on an
21 analysis of travel patterns, potentially poses a na-
22 tional security risk to the United States or its inter-
23 ests.
