At the end of title LI of division E, add the following:

1	SEC. 51 INCLUSION OF VETERANS IN HOUSING PLAN-
2	NING.
3	(a) Public Housing Agency Plans.—Section
4	5A(d)(1) of the United States Housing Act of 1937 (42
5	U.S.C. $1437e-1(d)(1)$ ) is amended by striking "and dis-
6	abled families" and inserting ", disabled families, and vet-
7	erans (as such term is defined in section 101 of title 38,
8	United States Code)".
9	(b) Comprehensive Housing Affordability
10	STRATEGIES.—
11	(1) In General.—Section 105 of the Cran-
12	ston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42
13	U.S.C. 12705) is amended—
14	(A) in subsection (b)(1), by inserting "vet-
15	erans (as such term is defined in section 101 of
16	title 38, United States Code)," after "acquired
17	immunodeficiency syndrome,";

1	(B) in subsection $(b)(20)$ , by striking "and
2	service" and inserting "veterans service, and
3	other service"; and
4	(C) in subsection (e)(1), by inserting "vet-
5	erans (as such term is defined in section 101 of
6	title 38, United States Code)," after "homeless
7	persons,".
8	(2) Consolidated Plans.—The Secretary of
9	Housing and Urban Development shall revise the
10	regulations relating to submission of consolidated
11	plans (part 91 of title 24, Code of Federal Regula-
12	tions) in accordance with the amendments made by
13	paragraph (1) of this subsection to require inclusion
14	of appropriate information relating to veterans and
15	veterans service agencies in all such plans.
16	SEC. 51 ANNUAL REPORT ON HOUSING ASSISTANCE TO
17	VETERANS.
18	(a) In General.—Not later than December 31 of
19	each year, the Secretary of Housing and Urban Develop-
20	ment shall submit a report on the activities of the Depart-
21	ment of Housing and Urban Development relating to vet-
22	erans during such year to the following:
23	(1) The Committee on Banking, Housing, and
24	Urban Affairs of the Senate.

1	(2) The Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
2	Senate.
3	(3) The Committee on Appropriations of the
4	Senate.
5	(4) The Committee on Financial Services of the
6	House of Representatives.
7	(5) The Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
8	House of Representatives.
9	(6) The Committee on Appropriations of the
10	House of Representatives.
11	(7) The Secretary of Veterans Affairs.
12	(b) Contents.—Each report required under sub-
13	section (a) shall include the following information with re-
14	spect to the year for which the report is submitted:
15	(1) The number of homeless veterans provided
16	assistance under the program of housing choice
17	vouchers for homeless veterans under section
18	8(o)(19) of the United States Housing Act of 1937
19	(42 U.S.C. 1437f(o)(19)), the socioeconomic charac-
20	teristics and racial characteristics of such homeless
21	veterans, and the number, types, and locations of en-
22	tities contracted under such section to administer
23	the vouchers.
24	(2) The number of homeless veterans provided
25	assistance under the Tribal HUD-VA Supportive

1	Housing Program (HUD-VASH) authorized by the
2	Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropria-
3	tions Act, 2015 (Pub. L. 113–235; 128 Stat. 2733),
4	the socioeconomic characteristics and racial charac-
5	teristics of such homeless veterans, and the number,
6	types, and locations of entities contracted under
7	such section to administer the vouchers.
8	(3) A summary description of the special con-
9	siderations made for veterans under public housing
10	agency plans submitted pursuant to section 5A of
11	the United States Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C.
12	1437c-1) and under comprehensive housing afford-
13	ability strategies submitted pursuant to section 105
14	of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Hous-
15	ing Act (42 U.S.C. 12705).
16	(4) A description of the activities of the Special
17	Assistant for Veterans Affairs.
18	(5) A description of the efforts of the Depart-
19	ment of Housing and Urban Development to coordi-
20	nate the delivery of housing and services to veterans
21	with other Federal departments and agencies, in-
22	cluding the Department of Defense, Department of
23	Justice, Department of Labor, Department of
24	Health and Human Services, Department of Vet-

1	erans Affairs, and the Interagency Council on
2	Homelessness.
3	(6) The cost to the Department of Housing and
4	Urban Development of administering the programs
5	and activities relating to veterans.
6	(7) Any other information that the Secretary
7	considers relevant in assessing the programs and ac-
8	tivities of the Department of Housing and Urban
9	Development relating to veterans.
10	(c) Assessment of Housing Needs of Very Low-
11	INCOME VETERAN FAMILIES.—
12	(1) In general.—For the first report sub-
13	mitted pursuant to subsection (a) and every fifth re-
14	port thereafter, the Secretary of Housing and Urban
15	Development shall—
16	(A) conduct an assessment of the housing
17	needs of very low-income veteran families (as
18	such term is defined in paragraph 5); and
19	(B) shall include in each such report find-
20	ings regarding such assessment.
21	(2) Content.—Each assessment under this
22	subsection shall include—
23	(A) conducting a survey of, and direct
24	interviews with, a representative sample of very
25	low-income veteran families (as such term is de-

1	fined in paragraph 5) to determine past and
2	current—
3	(i) socioeconomic characteristics of
4	such veteran families;
5	(ii) barriers to such veteran families
6	obtaining safe, quality, and affordable
7	housing;
8	(iii) levels of homelessness among
9	such veteran families; and
10	(iv) levels and circumstances of, and
11	barriers to, receipt by such veteran families
12	of rental housing and homeownership as-
13	sistance; and
14	(B) such other information that the Sec-
15	retary determines, in consultation with the Sec-
16	retary of Veterans Affairs and national non-
17	governmental organizations concerned with vet-
18	erans, homelessness, and very low-income hous-
19	ing, may be useful to the assessment.
20	(3) CONDUCT.—If the Secretary contracts with
21	an entity other than the Department of Housing and
22	Urban Development to conduct the assessment
23	under this subsection, such entity shall be a non-
24	governmental organization determined by the Sec-

1	retary to have appropriate expertise in quantitative
2	and qualitative social science research.
3	(4) Authorization of appropriations.—
4	There are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-
5	retary of Housing and Urban Development, to be
6	available until expended to carry out this subsection,
7	\$1,000,000.
8	(5) VERY LOW-INCOME VETERAN FAMILY.—The
9	term "very low-income veteran family" means a vet-
10	eran family whose income does not exceed 50 per-
11	cent of the median income for the area, as deter-
12	mined by the Secretary with adjustments for smaller
13	and larger families, except that the Secretary may
14	establish an income ceiling higher or lower than 50
15	percent of the median for the area on the basis of
16	the Secretary's findings that such variations are nec-
17	essary because of prevailing levels of construction
18	costs or fair market rents (as determined under sec-
19	tion 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937 (42



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U.S.C. 1437f)).
