

**AMENDMENT TO**  
**RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 117-54**  
**OFFERED BY MR. GREEN OF TENNESSEE**

At the end of subtitle A of title XII, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 12\_\_\_ . GENERAL THADDEUS KOSCIUSZKO EXCHANGE**  
2 **PROGRAM.**

3 (a) **AUTHORITY.**—The Commander of United States  
4 Army Special Operations Command shall seek to carry out  
5 a training program pursuant to section 322 of title 10,  
6 United States Code, between special operations forces  
7 under the jurisdiction of the Commander and special oper-  
8 ations forces of the Polish Army. Such program shall be  
9 known as the “General Thaddeus Kosciuszko Memorial  
10 Exchange Program for Polish-American Defense Coopera-  
11 tion”.

12 (b) **PURPOSES.**—The purposes of the program in-  
13 clude the following:

14 (1) To create an enduring training cooperation  
15 program to enhance the national security and defen-  
16 sive capabilities of the United States and Poland.

1           (2) To enable both countries to effectively re-  
2           spond to emerging threats and future challenges in  
3           Eastern Europe and around the globe.

4           (3) To increase the interoperability, combined  
5           readiness, joint planning capabilities, and shared sit-  
6           uational awareness between special operations forces  
7           described in subsection (a).

8           (4) To provide a program for the exchange of  
9           such special operations forces that will increase  
10          readiness and capacity to counter adversarial oper-  
11          ations, including—

12                 (A) enhancing and increasing the capa-  
13                 bility to counter irregular and asymmetrical  
14                 warfare;

15                 (B) enhancing and increasing the capa-  
16                 bility to respond to, and conduct, information  
17                 operations;

18                 (C) enhancing and increasing the capa-  
19                 bility to counter land and air assaults, including  
20                 the capacity to conduct urban warfare; and

21                 (D) any other relevant training that the  
22                 Secretary of Defense determines relevant, in-  
23                 cluding training at military training centers and  
24                 professional military education institutions of  
25                 the Department of Defense.

1           (5) To encourage the deepening and number of  
2           training programs among NATO allies and partners  
3           to strengthen joint resiliency, readiness, and deter-  
4           rence capabilities, to facilitate peace in the trans-  
5           atlantic region.

6           (c) ELIGIBILITY.—Officers and enlisted members of  
7           such special operations forces may participate in the pro-  
8           gram under this section.

9           (d) PROGRESS REPORT.—Not later than 120 days  
10          after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Com-  
11          mander shall submit to the Committees on Armed Services  
12          of the Senate and House of Representatives a report re-  
13          garding progress of the Commander in carrying out the  
14          training program.
