At the end of title VIII, add the following:

1	SEC EPINEPHRINE TRAINING.
2	(a) In General.—The Administrator of the Federal
3	Aviation Administration shall take such actions as are nec-
4	essary to require air carriers and foreign air carriers (as
5	such terms are defined in section 47102 of title 49, United
6	States Code) to have at least 1 crewmember on board
7	every aircraft operated by such air carrier or foreign air
8	carrier to be trained to administer epinephrine to a pas-
9	senger in the event of an allergy-related emergency.
10	(b) Training under subsection (a) shall
11	consist of the following:
12	(1) An initial anaphylaxis training program.
13	(2) A training program to be completed at least
14	every 2 years that is conducted by a nationally-rec-
15	ognized organization experienced in training unli-
16	censed persons in emergency healthcare treatment or
17	an entity or individual approved by the Federal
18	Aviation Administration, which may be conducted
19	online or in person and shall cover the following:

1	(A) How to recognize signs and symptoms
2	of severe allergic reactions, including anaphy-
3	laxis.
4	(B) Standards and procedures for the stor-
5	age and administration of an epinephrine auto-
6	injector.
7	(C) Emergency follow-up procedures after
8	epinephrine is administered, including the ne-
9	cessity of notifying emergency personnel.
10	(c) CERTIFICATE.—The entity or individual that con-
11	ducts the training shall issue a certificate, on a form devel-
12	oped or approved by the department of Federal Aviation
13	Administration, to each person who successfully completes
14	the anaphylaxis training program.
15	(d) Civil Liability.—The actions of a crewmember
16	under subsection (a) shall be covered under the Aviation
17	Medical Assistance Act of 1998 (Public Law 105–170).
