## AMENDMENT TO H.R. 8038 OFFERED BY MRS. HINSON OF IOWA

At the end of the bill (before the short title) insert the following:

## 1 SEC. \_\_. CRITICAL AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS OR INPUTS 2 STUDY.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Agriculture (in 4 this section referred to as the "Secretary") shall, on an 5 annual basis, submit to the Committee on Agriculture of 6 the House of Representatives and the Committee on Agri-7 culture, Nutrition, and Forestry of the Senate, an assessment of the dependency of the United States on critical 8 9 agricultural products or inputs that could be exploited in 10 the event the People's Republic of China weaponizes any 11 such critical dependency.

12 (b) CONTENTS.—The assessment under subsection13 (a) shall—

14 (1) address, with respect to the critical inputs15 specified in subsection (c), the following:

16 (A) the current domestic production capac-17 ity of each such critical input; and

(B) the current and potential bottlenecksin the supply chain for each such critical input

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1	that could be exploited by the People's Republic
2	of China; and
3	(2) contain the Secretary's recommendations to
4	reduce the dependency of the United States on the
5	People's Republic of China to supply critical agricul-
6	tural products or inputs, including—
7	(A) recommendations to mitigate potential
8	threats posed by the People's Republic of China
9	to the supply chains of each critical input speci-
10	fied in subsection (c); and
11	(B) recommendations for legislative and
12	regulatory actions to reduce barriers to onshore
13	or nearshore the production of each such crit-
14	ical input.
15	(c) CRITICAL INPUTS.—The critical inputs specified
16	in this subsection shall include all farm management, ag-
17	ronomic, and field-applied production inputs, including
18	each of the following:
19	(1) Agricultural equipment, machinery, and
20	technology.
21	(2) Fuel.
22	(3) Fertilizers.
23	(4) Feed, including its components, such as vi-
24	tamins, amino acids, and minerals.
25	(5) Veterinary drugs and vaccines.

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(6) Crop protection chemicals.

2 (7) Seed.

3 (8) Any other critical agricultural inputs, as de-4 termined by the Secretary.

5 (d) COLLECTION, DISTRIBUTION, AND PROTECTION6 OF INFORMATION.—

7 (1) VOLUNTARY BASIS.—In conducting an as8 sessment under subsection (a), the Secretary may
9 not require any private entity to provide information
10 to the Secretary.

(2) AGGREGATE DATA.—In the case of information provided to the Secretary to conduct an assessment under subsection (a), neither the Secretary,
any other officer or employee of the Department of
Agriculture or agency thereof, nor any other person
may—

17 (A) use such information for a purpose
18 other than the development or reporting of ag19 gregate data in a manner such that the identity
20 of the person who supplied such information is
21 not discernible and is not material to the in22 tended uses of such information; or

(B) disclose such information to the public,
unless such information has been transformed
into a statistical or aggregate form that does

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1	not allow the identification of the person who
2	supplied particular information.

3 (3) CONFIDENTIALITY.—The Secretary shall
4 ensure that assessments submitted under subsection
5 (a) do not include any information that is a trade
6 secret or confidential information subject to section
7 552(b)(4) of title 5, United States Code, or section
8 1905 of title 18, United States Code.

9 (4) IMMUNITY FROM DISCLOSURE.—Any infor-10 mation provided to the Secretary as part of an as-11 sessment conducted under subsection (a) may not be 12 used by the Secretary for any purpose other than to 13 carry out such subsection.

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
