AMENDMENT TO H.R. 4365, AS REPORTED OFFERED BY MS. HOYLE OF OREGON

At the end of the bill (before the short title), insert the following:

10	(1) Sharing intelligence for the purpose of ena-

12	(2) Providing logistical support for coalition

14	ferring spare parts to coalition members flying war-
15	planes engaged in anti-Houthi bombings.
16	(b) Prohibition Relating to Military Partici-
17	PATION.—None of the funds appropriated or otherwise
18	made available by this Act may be made available for any
19	civilian or military personnel of the Department of De-

- 1 fense to command, coordinate, participate in the move-
- 2 ment of, or accompany the regular or irregular military
- 3 forces of the Saudi and United Arab Emirates-led coali-
- 4 tion forces in hostilities against the Houthis in Yemen or
- 5 in situations in which there exists an imminent threat that
- 6 such coalition forces become engaged in such hostilities,
- 7 unless and until the President has obtained specific statu-
- 8 tory authorization, in accordance with section 8(a) of the
- 9 War Powers Resolution (50 U.S.C. 1547(a)).
- 10 (c) Rule of Construction.—The prohibitions
- 11 under this section may not be construed to apply with re-
- 12 spect to United States Armed Forces engaged in oper-
- 13 ations directed at al Qaeda or associated forces.
