At the end of subtitle B of title XVII, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 17__ . FACILITATING MONITORING OF HUMAN TRAF-**
2 **FICKING IN SUPPLY CHAIN OF SEAFOOD PUR-**
3 **CHASED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—In accordance with the time
5 frames issued pursuant to subsection (b)(1), the deadline
6 described under subsection (b)(2), and except as provided
7 in subsection (c), the Director of the Office of Manage-
8 ment and Budget shall ensure that the searchable, public
9 website established pursuant to section 2(b)(1) of the Fed-
10 eral Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of
11 2006 (31 U.S.C. 6101 note) includes the following infor-
12 mation regarding each covered Federal award related to
13 the purchase of seafood with respect to entities located
14 in the United States and outside of the United States:

15 (1) The location of the entity receiving the
16 award and the location of each performance or pro-
17 duction facility under the award, including the ad-

1 dress, city, State (if applicable), congressional dis-
2 trict (if applicable), and country of any such facility.

3 (2) Notice of whether the entity receiving the
4 award was required to provide a compliance plan to
5 prevent human trafficking under section 1703 of the
6 National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year
7 2013 (22 U.S.C. 1704a).

8 (3) Notice of whether the location of any per-
9 formance or production facility is within a country
10 ranked at tier 2 or tier 3 in the most recent Human
11 Trafficking Report of the Department of State.

12 (4) Additional information that facilitates moni-
13 toring and investigation of human trafficking.

14 (b) PHASE-IN PERIOD FOR REPORTING SUB-
15 CONTRACTS AND SUBGRANTS.—The Director shall—

16 (1) not later than 2 years after the date of the
17 enactment of this section, issue a plan that includes
18 required time frames for the phase-in of the infor-
19 mation included pursuant to subsection (a); and

20 (2) not later than 4 years after the date of the
21 enactment of this section, require reporting by agen-
22 cies of any subcontract of a subcontract (at any tier)
23 and any subgrant of a subgrant (at any tier).

24 (c) EXCEPTION.—

1 (1) SECURITY RISKS.—The head of an agency
2 is not required to disclose the identity of a recipient
3 located outside of the United States of a covered
4 Federal award pursuant to subsection (a) if the head
5 of the agency certifies that disclosure of the identity
6 of the recipient would pose a security risk to the re-
7 cipient or the requirements of the underlying con-
8 tract.

9 (2) LIMIT TO EXCEPTION.—The head of an
10 agency may not except more than 10 percent of the
11 covered Federal awards for that agency under para-
12 graph (1).

13 (3) ANNUAL REPORT TO CONGRESS.—The Di-
14 rector shall submit to Congress a report each year
15 on any exception made under paragraph (1) that in-
16 cludes the rationale for such exception.

17 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

18 (1) The term “agency” has the meaning given
19 the term “executive agency” in section 133 of title
20 41, United States Code.

21 (2) The term “covered Federal award” means
22 a Federal award, including any subaward (at any
23 tier)—

24 (A) for less than \$25,000; or

1 (B) to an awardee with a gross income less
2 than \$300,000 in the previous year.

3 (3) The term “Director” means the Director of
4 the Office of Management and Budget.

5 (4) The term “Federal award” has the meaning
6 given that term in section 2(a) of the Federal Fund-
7 ing Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006
8 (31 U.S.C. 6101 note).

9 (5) The term “seafood”—

10 (A) means fish meal and all marine animal
11 and plant life meant for consumption as food;

12 (B) includes fish, shellfish, shellfish prod-
13 ucts, processed fish, and fish products; and

14 (C) does not include marine mammals or
15 birds.
