1	DIVISION E—FISCAL
2	COMMISSION ACT OF 2023
3	SEC. 801. SHORT TITLE.
4	This division may be cited as the "Fiscal Commission
5	Act of 2023".
6	SEC. 802. DEFINITIONS.
7	In this division:
8	(1) Co-chair.—The term "co-chair" means an
9	individual appointed to serve as a co-chair of the
10	Fiscal Commission under section 803(a)(3)(C)(i).
11	(2) FISCAL COMMISSION.—The term "Fiscal
12	Commission" means the commission established
13	under section 803(a).
14	(3) FISCAL COMMISSION BILL.—The term "Fis-
15	cal Commission bill" means a bill consisting solely of
16	legislative language that the Fiscal Commission ap-
17	proves and submits under clauses (i) and (v), respec-
18	tively, of section 803(a)(2)(B).

(4) Outside expert.—The term "outside ex-

pert" is an individual who is not an elected official

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1	or an officer or employee of the Federal Government
2	or of any State.
3	SEC. 803. ESTABLISHMENT OF FISCAL COMMISSION.
4	(a) Establishment of Fiscal Commission.—
5	(1) Establishment.—No later than 60 days
6	after the date of enactment of this Act, there is es-
7	tablished in Congress a Fiscal Commission.
8	(2) Duties.—
9	(A) Improve fiscal situation.—
10	(i) In General.—The Fiscal Com-
11	mission shall identify policies to improve
12	the fiscal situation in the medium term
13	and to achieve a sustainable debt-to-GDP
14	ratio of the long term, and for any rec-
15	ommendations related to Federal programs
16	for which a Federal trust fund exists, to
17	improve solvency for a period of at least 75
18	years.
19	(ii) Requirements.—In carrying out
20	clause (i), the Fiscal Commission shall—
21	(I) propose recommendations de-
22	signed to balance the budget at the
23	earliest reasonable date, including at
24	minimum stabilizing the debt-to-GDP
25	ratio at or below one hundred percent

1	by the end of the 10-year period be-
2	ginning on the date the Fiscal Com-
3	mission is established; and
4	(II) propose recommendations
5	that meaningfully improve the long-
6	term fiscal outlook, including changes
7	to address the growth of direct spend-
8	ing and the gap between the projected
9	revenues and expenditures of the Fed-
10	eral Government.
11	(iii) Recommendations of commit-
12	TEES.—Not later than 60 days after the
13	date described in paragraph (1), each com-
14	mittee of the Senate and the House of
15	Representatives may transmit to the Fiscal
16	Commission any recommendations of the
17	committee relating to changes in law to
18	further the duties described in clause (ii).
19	(B) Report, recommendations, and
20	LEGISLATIVE LANGUAGE.—
21	(i) In General.—Notwithstanding
22	paragraph (4)(D)(ii)(II), not earlier than
23	November 6, 2024, but not later than No-
24	vember 15, 2024, the Fiscal Commission
25	shall meet to consider, and vote on—

1	(I) a report that contains a de-
2	tailed statement of the findings, con-
3	clusions, and recommendations of the
4	Fiscal Commission described in sub-
5	paragraph (A)(i) and the estimate of
6	the Congressional Budget Office re-
7	quired under paragraph (4)(D)(ii);
8	and
9	(II) legislative language to carry
10	out the recommendations of the Fiscal
11	Commission in the report described in
12	subclause (I), which shall include a
13	statement of the economic and budg-
14	etary effects of the recommendations.
15	(ii) Approval of report and leg-
16	ISLATIVE LANGUAGE.—A report and legis-
17	lative language of the Fiscal Commission
18	under clause (i) shall require the approval
19	of a majority of the members of the Fiscal
20	Commission, provided that such majority
21	shall be required to include not less than
22	3 members of the Fiscal Commission ap-
23	pointed by members of the Republican
24	Party and 3 members appointed by mem-
25	bers of the Democratic party.

1	(iii) Additional views.—
2	(I) In general.—A member of
3	the Fiscal Commission who gives no-
4	tice of an intention to file supple-
5	mental, minority, or additional views
6	at the time of the final Fiscal Com-
7	mission vote on the approval of the re-
8	port and legislative language of the
9	Fiscal Commission under clause (i)
10	shall be entitled to 3 days to file those
11	views in writing with the staff director
12	of the Fiscal Commission.
13	(II) Inclusion in report.—
14	Views filed under subclause (I) shall
15	be included in the report of the Fiscal
16	Commission under clause (i) and
17	printed in the same volume, or part
18	thereof, and such inclusion shall be
19	noted on the cover of the report, ex-
20	cept that, in the absence of timely no-
21	tice, the report may be printed and
22	transmitted immediately without such
23	views.
24	(iv) Report and Legislative Lan-
25	GUAGE TO BE MADE PUBLIC.—Upon the

1	approval or disapproval of a report and
2	legislative language under clause (i) by the
3	Fiscal Commission, the Fiscal Commission
4	shall promptly, and not more than 24
5	hours after the approval or disapproval or,
6	if timely notice is given under clause (iii),
7	not more than 24 hours after additional
8	views are filed under such clause, make the
9	report, the legislative language, and a
10	record of the vote on the report and legis-
11	lative language available to the public.
12	(v) Submission of Report and Leg-
13	ISLATIVE LANGUAGE.—If a report and leg-
14	islative language are approved by the Fis-
15	cal Commission under clause (i), not later
16	than 3 days after the date on which the re-
17	port and legislative language are made
18	available to the public under clause (iv),
19	the Fiscal Commission shall submit the re-
20	port and legislative language to the Presi-
21	dent, the Vice President, the Speaker of
22	the House of Representatives, and the ma-
23	jority and minority leaders of each House
24	of Congress.
25	(3) Membership.—

1	(A) IN GENERAL.—The Fiscal Commission
2	shall be composed of 16 members appointed in
3	accordance with subparagraph (B) and with
4	due consideration to chairs and ranking mem-
5	bers of the committees and subcommittees of
6	subject matter jurisdiction, if applicable.
7	(B) Appointment.—Not later than 14
8	days after the date described in paragraph
9	(1)—
10	(i) the majority leader of the Senate
11	shall appoint 3 individuals from among the
12	Members of the Senate, and 1 outside ex-
13	pert, who shall serve as members of the
14	Fiscal Commission;
15	(ii) the minority leader of the Senate
16	shall appoint 3 individuals from among the
17	Members of the Senate, and 1 outside ex-
18	pert who shall serve as members of the
19	Fiscal Commission;
20	(iii) the Speaker of the House of Rep-
21	resentatives shall appoint 3 individuals
22	from among the Members of the House of
23	Representatives, and 1 outside expert, who
24	shall serve as members of the Fiscal Com-
25	mission; and

1	(iv) the minority leader of the House
2	of Representatives shall appoint 3 individ-
3	uals from among the Members of the
4	House of Representatives, and 1 outside
5	expert, who shall serve as members of the
6	Fiscal Commission.
7	(C) Co-chairs.—
8	(i) In general.—Not later than 14
9	days after the date described in paragraph
10	(1), with respect to the Fiscal Commis-
11	sion—
12	(I) the leadership of the Senate
13	and House of Representatives of the
14	same political party as the President
15	shall appoint 1 individual from among
16	the members of the Fiscal Commis-
17	sion who shall serve as a co-chair of
18	the Fiscal Commission; and
19	(II) the leadership of the Senate
20	and House of Representatives of the
21	opposite political party as the Presi-
22	dent, shall appoint 1 individual from
23	among the members of the Fiscal
24	Commission who shall serve as a co-
25	chair of the Fiscal Commission.

1	(ii) Staff director.—With respect
2	to the Fiscal Commission, the co-chairs of
3	the Fiscal Commission, acting jointly, shall
4	hire the staff director of the Fiscal Com-
5	mission.
6	(D) Period of Appointment.—
7	(i) In general.—The members of
8	the Fiscal Commission shall be appointed
9	for the life of the Fiscal Commission.
10	(ii) Vacancy.—
11	(I) IN GENERAL.—Any vacancy
12	in the Fiscal Commission shall not af-
13	fect the powers of the Fiscal Commis-
14	sion, but shall be filled not later than
15	14 days after the date on which the
16	vacancy occurs, in the same manner
17	as the original appointment was
18	made.
19	(II) Ineligible members.—If a
20	member of the Fiscal Commission who
21	was appointed as a Member of the
22	Senate or the House Representatives
23	ceases to be a Member of the Senate
24	or the House of Representatives, as
25	applicable—

1	(aa) the member shall no
2	longer be a member of the Fiscal
3	Commission; and
4	(bb) a vacancy in the Fiscal
5	Commission exists.
6	(4) Administration.—
7	(A) IN GENERAL.—With respect to the
8	Fiscal Commission, to enable the Fiscal Com-
9	mission to exercise the powers, functions, and
10	duties of the Fiscal Commission, there are au-
11	thorized to be disbursed by the Senate the ac-
12	tual and necessary expenses of the Fiscal Com-
13	mission approved by the co-chairs of the Fiscal
14	Commission, subject to the rules and regula-
15	tions of the Senate.
16	(B) Expenses.—With respect to the Fis-
17	cal Commission, in carrying out the functions of
18	the Fiscal Commission, the Fiscal Commission
19	is authorized to incur expenses in the same
20	manner and under the same conditions as the
21	Joint Economic Committee is authorized under
22	section 11(d) of the Employment Act of 1946
23	(15 U.S.C. 1024(d)).
24	(C) QUORUM.—With respect to the Fiscal
25	Commission, 9 members of the Fiscal Commis-

1	sion shall constitute a quorum for purposes of
2	voting, meeting, and holding hearings.
3	(D) Voting.—
4	(i) Proxy voting.—No proxy voting
5	shall be allowed on behalf of any member
6	of the Fiscal Commission.
7	(ii) Congressional budget office
8	ESTIMATES.—
9	(I) In General.—The Director
10	of the Congressional Budget Office
11	shall, with respect to the legislative
12	language of the Fiscal Commission
13	under paragraph (2)(B)(i)(II), provide
14	to the Fiscal Commission—
15	(aa) estimates of the legisla-
16	tive language in accordance with
17	sections 308(a) and 201(f) of the
18	Congressional Budget Act of
19	1974 (2 U.S.C. 639(a) and
20	601(f)); and
21	(bb) information on the
22	budgetary effect of the legislative
23	language on the long-term fiscal
24	outlook.

1	(II) LIMITATION.—The Fiscal
2	Commission may not vote on any
3	version of the report, recommenda-
4	tions, or legislative language of the
5	Fiscal Commission under paragraph
6	(2)(B)(i) unless the estimates and in-
7	formation described in subclause (I)
8	of this clause are made available for
9	consideration by all members of the
10	Fiscal Commission not later than 48
11	hours before that vote, as certified by
12	the co-chairs of the Fiscal Commis-
13	sion.
14	(E) Meetings.—
15	(i) Initial meeting.—Not later than
16	45 days after the date described in para-
17	graph (1), the Fiscal Commission shall
18	hold the first meeting of the Fiscal Com-
19	mission.
20	(ii) Agenda.—For each meeting of
21	the Fiscal Commission, the co-chairs of the
22	Fiscal Commission shall provide an agenda
23	to the members of the Fiscal Commission
24	not later than 48 hours before the meeting.
25	(F) Hearings.—

1	(i) In general.—The Fiscal Com-
2	mission may, for the purpose of carrying
3	out this section, hold such hearings, sit
4	and act at such times and places, require
5	attendance of witnesses and production of
6	books, papers, and documents, take such
7	testimony, receive such evidence, and ad-
8	minister such oaths as the Fiscal Commis-
9	sion considers advisable.
10	(ii) Hearing procedures and re-
11	SPONSIBILITIES OF CO-CHAIRS.—
12	(I) Announcement.—The co-
13	chairs of the Fiscal Commission shall
14	make a public announcement of the
15	date, place, time, and subject matter
16	of any hearing to be conducted under
17	this subparagraph not later than 7
18	days before the date of the hearing,
19	unless the co-chairs determine that
20	there is good cause to begin such
21	hearing on an earlier date.
22	(II) Written statement.—A
23	witness appearing before the Fiscal
24	Commission shall file a written state-
25	ment of the proposed testimony of the

1	witness not later than 2 days before
2	the date of the appearance of the wit-
3	ness, unless the co-chairs of the Fiscal
4	Commission—
5	(aa) determine that there is
6	good cause for the witness to not
7	file the written statement; and
8	(bb) waive the requirement
9	that the witness file the written
10	statement.
11	(G) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.—Upon writ-
12	ten request of the co-chairs of the Fiscal Com-
13	mission, the head of a Federal agency shall pro-
14	vide technical assistance to the Fiscal Commis-
15	sion in order for the Fiscal Commission to
16	carry out the duties of the Fiscal Commission.
17	(H) Outside expert.—Any outside ex-
18	pert appointed to the Fiscal Commission—
19	(i) shall not be considered to be a
20	Federal employee for any purpose by rea-
21	son of service on the Fiscal Commission;
22	and
23	(ii) shall be allowed travel expenses,
24	including per diem in lieu of subsistence,
25	at rates authorized for employees of agen-

1	cies under subchapter I of chapter 57 of
2	title 5, United States Code, while away
3	from their homes or regular places of busi-
4	ness in the performance of services for the
5	Commission.
6	(b) Staff of Fiscal Commission.—
7	(1) In general.—The co-chairs of the Fiscal
8	Commission may jointly appoint and fix the com-
9	pensation of staff of the Fiscal Commission as the
10	co-chairs determine necessary, in accordance with
11	the guidelines, rules, and requirements relating to
12	employees of the Senate.
13	(2) ETHICAL STANDARDS.—
14	(A) Senate.—Members appointed by
15	Members of the Senate who serve on the Fiscal
16	Commission and staff of the Fiscal Commission
17	shall adhere to the ethics rules of the Senate.
18	(B) House of representatives.—Mem-
19	bers appointed by Members of the House of
20	Representatives who serve on the Fiscal Com-
21	mission shall be governed by the ethics rules
22	and requirements of the House of Representa-
23	tives.
24	(c) Termination.—The Fiscal Commission shall ter-
25	minate on the date that is 30 days after the date the Fis-

1	cal Commission submits the report under subsection
2	(a)(2)(B)(v).
3	SEC. 804. EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION OF FISCAL COMMIS-
4	SION BILLS.
5	(a) Qualifying Legislation.—Only a Fiscal Com-
6	mission bill shall be entitled to expedited consideration
7	under this section.
8	(b) Consideration in the House of Represent-
9	ATIVES.—
10	(1) Introduction.—If the Fiscal Commission
11	approves and submits legislative language under
12	clauses (i) and (v), respectively, of section
13	803(a)(2)(B), the Fiscal Commission bill consisting
14	solely of that legislative language shall be introduced
15	in the House of Representatives (by request)—
16	(A) by the majority leader of the House of
17	Representatives, or by a Member of the House
18	of Representatives designated by the majority
19	leader of the House of Representatives, on the
20	third legislative day after the date the Fiscal
21	Commission approves and submits such legisla-
22	tive language; or
23	(B) if the Fiscal Commission bill is not in-
24	troduced under subparagraph (A), by any Mem-
25	ber of the House of Representatives on any leg-

1 islative day beginning on the legislative day 2 after the legislative day described in subpara-3 graph (A). 4 (2) Referral and Reporting.—Any com-5 mittee of the House of Representatives to which a 6 Fiscal Commission bill is referred shall report the 7 Fiscal Commission bill to the House of Representa-8 tives without amendment not later than 5 legislative 9 days after the date on which the Fiscal Commission 10 bill was so referred. If any committee of the House 11 of Representatives to which a Fiscal Commission bill 12 is referred fails to report the Fiscal Commission bill 13 within that period, that committee shall be auto-14 matically discharged from consideration of the Fiscal 15 Commission bill, and the Fiscal Commission bill 16 shall be placed on the appropriate calendar. 17 (3) Proceeding to Consideration.—After 18 the last committee authorized to consider a Fiscal 19 Commission bill reports it to the House of Rep-20 resentatives or has been discharged from its consid-21 eration, it shall be in order to move to proceed to 22 consider the Fiscal Commission bill in the House of 23 Representatives. Such a motion shall not be in order 24 after the House of Representatives has disposed of

a motion to proceed with respect to the Fiscal Com-

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1	mission bill. The previous question shall be consid-
2	ered as ordered on the motion to its adoption with-
3	out intervening motion.
4	(4) Consideration.—The Fiscal Commission
5	bill shall be considered as read. All points of order
6	against the Fiscal Commission bill and against its
7	consideration are waived. The previous question
8	shall be considered as ordered on the Fiscal Com-
9	mission bill to its passage without intervening mo-
10	tion except 2 hours of debate equally divided and
11	controlled by the proponent and an opponent.
12	(5) Vote on passage.—The vote on passage
13	of the Fiscal Commission bill shall occur pursuant to
14	the constraints under clause 8 of rule XX of the
15	Rules of the House of Representatives.
16	(c) Expedited Procedure in the Senate.—
17	(1) Introduction in the senate.—If the
18	Fiscal Commission approves and submits legislative
19	language under clauses (i) and (v), respectively, of
20	section 803(a)(2)(B), a Fiscal Commission bill con-
21	sisting solely of that legislative language may be in-
22	troduced in the Senate (by request)—
23	(A) by the majority leader of the Senate
24	or by a Member of the Senate designated by the

1	majority leader of the Senate, on the next day
2	on which the Senate is in session; or
3	(B) if the Fiscal Commission bill is not in-
4	troduced under subparagraph (A), by any Mem-
5	ber of the Senate on any day on which the Sen-
6	ate is in session beginning on the day after the
7	day described in subparagraph (A).
8	(2) Committee consideration.—A Fiscal
9	Commission bill introduced in the Senate under
10	paragraph (1) shall be jointly referred to the com-
11	mittee or committees of jurisdiction, which commit-
12	tees shall report the Fiscal Commission bill without
13	any revision and with a favorable recommendation,
14	an unfavorable recommendation, or without rec-
15	ommendation, not later than 5 session days after the
16	date on which the Fiscal Commission bill was so re-
17	ferred. If any committee to which a Fiscal Commis-
18	sion bill is referred fails to report the Fiscal Com-
19	mission bill within that period, that committee shall
20	be automatically discharged from consideration of
21	the Fiscal Commission bill, and the Fiscal Commis-
22	sion bill shall be placed on the appropriate calendar.
23	(3) Proceeding.—Notwithstanding rule XXII
24	of the Standing Rules of the Senate, it is in order,
25	not later than 2 days of session after the date on

1	which a Fiscal Commission bill is reported or dis-
2	charged from all committees to which the Fiscal
3	Commission bill was referred, for the majority leader
4	of the Senate or the designee of the majority leader
5	to move to proceed to the consideration of the Fiscal
6	Commission bill. It shall also be in order for any
7	Member of the Senate to move to proceed to the
8	consideration of the Fiscal Commission bill at any
9	time after the conclusion of such 2-day period. A
10	motion to proceed is in order even though a previous
11	motion to the same effect has been disagreed to. All
12	points of order against the motion to proceed to the
13	Fiscal Commission bill are waived. The motion to
14	proceed is not debatable. The motion is not subject
15	to a motion to postpone. A motion to reconsider the
16	vote by which the motion is agreed to or disagreed
17	to shall not be in order. If a motion to proceed to
18	the consideration of the Fiscal Commission bill is
19	agreed to, the Fiscal Commission bill shall remain
20	the unfinished business until disposed of. All points
21	of order against a Fiscal Commission bill and
22	against consideration of the Fiscal Commission bill
23	are waived.
24	(4) No amendment to a
25	Fiscal Commission bill, or a motion to postpone, or

1	a motion to proceed to the consideration of other
2	business, or a motion to recommit the Fiscal Com-
3	mission bill, is not in order.
4	(5) Rulings of the chair on procedure.—
5	Appeals from the decisions of the Chair relating to
6	the application of the rules of the Senate, as the
7	case may be, to the procedure relating to a Fiscal
8	Commission bill shall be decided without debate.
9	(d) Amendment.—A Fiscal Commission bill shall
10	not be subject to amendment in either the Senate or the
11	House of Representatives.
12	(e) Consideration by the Other House.—
13	(1) In general.—If, before passing a Fiscal
14	Commission bill, a House receives from the other
15	House a Fiscal Commission bill consisting of legisla-
16	tive language approved by the same Fiscal Commis-
17	sion as the Fiscal Commission bill in the receiving
18	House—
19	(A) the Fiscal Commission bill of the other
20	House shall not be referred to a committee; and
21	(B) the procedure in the receiving House
22	shall be the same as if no Fiscal Commission
23	bill had been received from the other House
24	until the vote on passage, when the Fiscal Com-
25	mission bill received from the other House shall

1	supplant the Fiscal Commission bill of the re-
2	ceiving House.
3	(2) REVENUE MEASURES.—This subsection
4	shall not apply to the House of Representatives if a
5	Fiscal Commission bill received from the Senate is
6	a revenue measure.
7	(f) Rules to Coordinate Action With Other
8	House.—
9	(1) Treatment of fiscal commission bill
10	OF OTHER HOUSE.—If a Fiscal Commission bill is
11	not introduced in the Senate or the Senate fails to
12	consider a Fiscal Commission bill under this section,
13	the Fiscal Commission bill of the House of Rep-
14	resentatives consisting of legislative language ap-
15	proved by the same Fiscal Commission as the Fiscal
16	Commission bill in the Senate shall be entitled to ex-
17	pedited floor procedures under this section.
18	(2) Treatment of companion measures in
19	THE SENATE.—If, following passage of a Fiscal
20	Commission bill in the Senate, the Senate then re-
21	ceives from the House of Representatives a Fiscal
22	Commission bill approved by the same Fiscal Com-
23	mission and consisting of the same legislative lan-
24	guage as the Senate-passed Fiscal Commission bill,
25	the House-passed Fiscal Commission bill shall not

1	be debatable. The vote on passage of the Fiscal
2	Commission bill in the Senate shall be considered to
3	be the vote on passage of the Fiscal Commission bill
4	received from the House of Representatives.
5	(3) Vetoes.—If the President vetoes a Fiscal
6	Commission bill, consideration of a veto message in
7	the Senate under this paragraph shall be 10 hours
8	equally divided between the majority and minority
9	leaders of the Senate or the designees of the major-
10	ity and minority leaders of the Senate.
11	SEC. 805. FUNDING.
12	Funding for the Fiscal Commission shall be derived
13	in equal portions from—
14	(1) the contingent fund of the Senate from the
15	appropriations account "Miscellaneous Items", sub-
16	ject to the rules and regulations of the Senate; and
17	(2) the applicable accounts of the House of
18	Representatives.
19	SEC. 806. RULEMAKING.
20	The provisions of this division are enacted by Con-
21	gress—
22	(1) as an exercise of the rulemaking power of
23	the Senate and the House of Representatives, re-
24	spectively, and, as such, the provisions—

1	(A) shall be considered as part of the rules
2	of each House, respectively, or of that House to
3	which they specifically apply; and
4	(B) shall supersede other rules only to the
5	extent that they are inconsistent therewith; and
6	(2) with full recognition of the constitutional
7	right of either House to change such rules (so far
8	as relating to such House) at any time, in the same
9	manner, and to the same extent as in the case of
10	any other rule of such House.
