

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 118-36
OFFERED BY MR. MOSKOWITZ OF FLORIDA

At the end of subtitle B of title XVII, add the following new section:

1 **SEC. 17___. COUNTERING THE NUCLEAR PROGRAM OF**
2 **IRAN.**

3 (a) STATEMENT OF POLICY.—It is the policy of the
4 United States, consistent with the Jerusalem Declaration,
5 signed on July 14, 2022, by the United States and Israel,
6 to never allow Iran to acquire a nuclear weapon and to
7 use all elements of national power to prevent it from doing
8 so.

9 (b) ANNUAL REPORT.—

10 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State, in
11 coordination with the Secretary of Defense and the
12 Secretary of the Treasury, shall annually submit to
13 the appropriate congressional committees a report
14 on the efforts undertaken within the preceding year
15 to prevent Iran from obtaining a nuclear weapon, in-
16 cluding an analysis of the following measures:

17 (A) Economic sanctions measures, includ-
18 ing—

1 (i) a detailed overview of the specific
2 sanctions implemented and targets des-
3 ignated, including but not limited to those
4 related to Iran's oil sector, financial sys-
5 tems, shipping, missile proliferation, and
6 other critical industries;

7 (ii) metrics on the impact of these
8 sanctions on Iran's economy and ability to
9 fund its nuclear program; and

10 (iii) international cooperation under-
11 taken and any challenges encountered in
12 enforcing sanctions across different juris-
13 dictions.

14 (B) Intelligence sharing and declassifica-
15 tion, including—

16 (i) the extent and scope of intel-
17 ligence-sharing activities with allied na-
18 tions and other relevant partners; and

19 (ii) information on any intelligence de-
20 classification that has been used to bolster
21 international support against Iran's nu-
22 clear activities or prevent its expansion.

23 (C) Diplomatic engagements, including—

24 (i) diplomatic efforts made to increase
25 pressure on Iran, including within inter-

1 national organizations such as the Inter-
2 national Atomic Energy Agency, to ensure
3 rigorous monitoring and verification of
4 Iran's nuclear activities; and

5 (ii) a summary of key diplomatic en-
6 gagements, the outcomes of these engage-
7 ments, and their impact on constraining
8 Iran's nuclear program.

9 (D) Military preparation, training, and co-
10 ordination, including—

11 (i) details on the development and im-
12 plementation of military strategies to pre-
13 vent Iran from acquiring nuclear weapons,
14 including contingency plans, force posture
15 adjustments, and resource allocations;

16 (ii) a summary of joint military exer-
17 cises or training conducted with regional
18 partners and allies, including Israel, to
19 build partner capacity, enhance readiness,
20 and increase interoperability;

21 (iii) an outline of efforts to strengthen
22 regional security frameworks, such as inte-
23 grated air and missile defense systems, in-
24 cluding additional information on arms
25 sales and military assistance; and

1 (iv) information on any other military
2 activities, such as targeting Iran-backed
3 militias in the region and reinforcing
4 United States force structure to impact
5 Iran's strategic calculations.

6 (2) FORM.—The report required by paragraph
7 (1) shall be submitted in an unclassified form, but
8 may contain a classified annex.

9 (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES.—
10 In this section, the term “appropriate congressional com-
11 mittees” means—

12 (1) the Committee on Armed Services, the
13 Committee on Foreign Relations, and the Committee
14 on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of the Sen-
15 ate; and

16 (2) the Committee on Armed Services, the
17 Committee on Foreign Affairs, and the Committee
18 on Financial Services of the House of Representa-
19 tives.
