AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 119-8 OFFERED BY MR. ISSA OF CALIFORNIA

At the end of subtitle C of title XII, add the following:

1	SEC. 12 LIMITATIONS ON SECURITY COOPERATION
2	WITH THE LEBANESE ARMED FORCES.
3	(a) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of Con-
4	gress that—
5	(1) United States security cooperation with
6	Lebanon must be directed toward the full implemen-
7	tation of United Nations Security Council Resolution
8	1701 (2006) and the disarmament of Hezbollah;
9	(2) enhanced advise-and-assist missions, cou-
10	pled with intelligence-sharing agreements, are nec-
11	essary to enable the Lebanese armed forces (LAF)
12	to detect, disrupt, and dismantle Hezbollah's weap-
13	ons stockpiles, smuggling routes, and command net-
14	works; and
15	(3) any United States assistance must be ac-
16	companied by strict monitoring, end-use verification,
17	and conditioning to ensure that resources are used
18	only to strengthen the Lebanese state and not di-
19	verted to Hezbollah or other malign actors.

1	(b) Authority.—The Secretary of Defense, in co-
2	ordination with the Secretary of State, is authorized to—
3	(1) expand advise-and-assist missions with the
4	LAF, including through special operations forces
5	and other appropriate units, for the purposes of—
6	(A) enhancing counter-rocket, counter-tun-
7	nel, and border security operations;
8	(B) supporting interdiction of illicit Ira-
9	nian weapons shipments; or
10	(C) improving command, control, and intel-
11	ligence fusion centers for operations against
12	Hezbollah and other designated terrorist orga-
13	nizations; and
14	(2) establish intelligence-sharing agreements
15	with the LAF, subject to appropriate security safe-
16	guards, to facilitate—
17	(A) real-time situational awareness of
18	Hezbollah military infrastructure;
19	(B) interdiction of cross-border weapons
20	smuggling; and
21	(C) joint operational planning in coordina-
22	tion with the United Nations Interim Force in
23	Lebanon where appropriate.
24	(c) Limitation on Assistance.—None of the funds
25	authorized to be appropriated by this Act for the Depart-

1	ment of Defense or otherwise made available for fiscal
2	year 2026 may be obligated or expended to support the
3	LAF unless the Secretary of Defense, in coordination with
4	the Secretary of State, certifies to the congressional de-
5	fense committees that—
6	(1) United States assistance is used exclusively
7	for operations against Hezbollah, Hamas, ISIS, or
8	other designated foreign terrorist organizations;
9	(2) the LAF has demonstrated progress in as-
10	suming operational control south of the Litani River
11	and dismantling unauthorized armed checkpoints or
12	depots; and
13	(3) end-use monitoring and vetting mechanisms
14	are in place to prevent diversion of assistance to
15	Hezbollah or affiliated entities.
