## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118– 36

## OFFERED BY MR. DONALDS OF FLORIDA

At the end of subtitle C of title XXXI, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 31 REPORT ON RADIOACTIVE ISOTOPES.
2	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
3	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Energy
4	shall submit to the Committee on Energy and Commerce
5	of the House of Representatives, the Committee on
6	Science, Space, and Technology of the House of Rep-
7	resentatives, the Committee on Energy and Natural Re-
8	sources of the Senate, and the Committee on Environment
9	and Public Works of the Senate a report on radioactive
10	isotopes that includes—
11	(1) a list of each radioactive isotope that can
12	only be produced by a foreign government or foreign
13	non-government person determined to be a foreign
14	adversary under section 7.4 of title 15, Code of Fed-
15	eral Regulations, or any successor regulation;
16	(2) a description of each radioactive isotope list-
17	ed under paragraph (1), including how such radio-

1	active isotope is produced and the potential uses of
2	such radioactive isotope;
3	(3) an examination of how reliance on any ra-
4	dioactive isotope listed under paragraph (1) may im-
5	pact the national security of the United States; and
6	(4) policy recommendations for bolstering pro-
7	duction of radioactive isotopes in the United States
8	including recommendations relating to the advance-
9	ment of advanced nuclear reactors and other tech-
10	nologies, including spent nuclear fuel recycling tech-
11	nologies, that may increase the potential to produce
12	radioactive isotopes.
13	(b) Definition.—In this section, the term "radio-
14	active isotope" means any—
15	(1) critical radioactive and stable isotope (as
16	defined in section 311(a) of the Department of En-
17	ergy Research and Innovation Act (42 U.S.C
18	18649(a)); or
19	(2) medical isotope (as defined in section 134 of
20	the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 (42 U.S.C. 2160d))
