

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 467, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MS. JACKSON LEE OF TEXAS**

At the end of the bill, add the following:

1 **SEC. 7. SENSE OF CONGRESS.**

2 It is the sense of Congress that fentanyl deaths
3 should be addressed by—

4 (1) increasing funding for prevention and treat-
5 ment programs, including—

6 (A) programs that provide education and
7 treatment for people who are at risk of opioid
8 addiction or overdose; and

9 (B) school-based programs, community
10 outreach programs, and treatment centers;

11 (2) expanding access to naloxone (a medication
12 that can reverse the effects of an opioid overdose)
13 such as by making naloxone available over-the-
14 counter or by providing subsidies for its purchase;

15 (3) cracking down on the trafficking of
16 fentanyl, including—

17 (A) increased efforts both domestically and
18 internationally;

19 (B) increased funding for law enforcement
20 agencies;

1 (C) increased penalties for fentanyl traf-
2 ficking; and

3 (D) working with other countries to stop
4 the flow of fentanyl across borders;

5 (4) improving data collection and analysis, in-
6 cluding the improvement of Federal data collection
7 and analysis on fentanyl deaths, to better under-
8 stand the scope of the problem and identify effective
9 prevention and treatment strategies; and

10 (5) supporting research on new treatment op-
11 tions, including—

12 (A) support for research on new treatment
13 options for opioid addiction and overdose; and

14 (B) funding for research on new medica-
15 tions, new delivery methods, and new ap-
16 proaches to treatment.
