11	vide any support to foreign forces, irregular
12	forces, groups, or individuals full consideration
13	is given to any credible information available to
14	the Department of State relating to violations
15	of human rights by such entities.".
16	(2) in subsection $(d)(2)$ —
17	(A) in subparagraph (H), by inserting ",

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including the promotion of good governance and

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1	rule of law and the protection of civilians and
2	human rights" before the period at the end;
3	(B) in subparagraph (I)—
4	(i) by striking the period at the end
5	and inserting "or violations of the Geneva
6	Conventions of 1949, including—"; and
7	(ii) by adding at the end the following
8	new clauses:
9	"(i) vetting units receiving such sup-
10	port for violations of human rights;
11	"(ii) providing human rights training
12	to units receiving such support; and
13	"(iii) providing for the investigation of
14	allegations of violations of human rights
15	and termination of such support in cases
16	of credible information of such violations.";
17	and
18	(C) by adding at the end the following new
19	subparagraph:
20	"(J) A description of the human rights
21	record of the recipient, including for purposes
22	of section 362 of this title, and any relevant at-
23	tempts by such recipient to remedy such
24	record.";

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(3) in subsection (i)(3) by adding at the end the
 following new subparagraph:

3 "(I) An assessment of how support pro4 vided under this section advances United States
5 national security priorities and aligns with
6 other United States Government efforts to ad7 dress underlying risk factors of terrorism and
8 violent extremism."; and

9 (4) by adding at the end the following new sub-10 section:

11 "(j) PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS.—(1) Except 12 as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3), no funds may be 13 used to provide support to any foreign forces, irregular 14 forces, groups, or individuals if the Secretary of Defense 15 has credible information that the unit has committed a 16 gross violation of human rights.

17 "(2) The Secretary of Defense, after consultation
18 with the Secretary of State, may waive the prohibition
19 under paragraph (1) if the Secretary determines that the
20 waiver is required by extraordinary circumstances.

"(3) The prohibition under paragraph (1) shall not
apply with respect to the foreign forces, irregular forces,
groups, or individuals of a country if the Secretary of Defense, after consultation with the Secretary of State, determines that—

"(A) the government of such country has taken
 all necessary corrective steps; or

3 "(B) the support is necessary to assist in dis4 aster relief operations or other humanitarian or na5 tional security emergencies.".

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
