Page 1714, after line 2, insert the following new section:

- 2 AT HIGHER RISK OF HOMELESSNESS.
- 3 (a) STUDY.—The Secretary of Housing and Urban
- 4 Development shall enter into an agreement with an orga-
- 5 nization having expertise in housing, homelessness, and in-
- 6 stitutional racism and structural and implicit bias to carry
- 7 out a study on the housing infrastructure needs of popu-
- 8 lations at higher risk of homelessness. The Secretary shall
- 9 provide for such organization to complete the study and
- 10 submit a report to the Secretary not later than the expira-
- 11 tion of the 1-year period beginning on the date of the en-
- 12 actment of this Act, which shall recommend regulatory,
- 13 policy and practice changes that would ensure that the De-
- 14 partment of Housing and Urban Development and other
- 15 Federal agencies effectively reduce and prevent homeless-
- 16 ness and housing instability faced by populations at higher
- 17 risk of homelessness.

1	(b) Information.—The report shall include infor-
2	mation derived from individuals who are members of, or
3	advocate on behalf of, or both, a population at higher risk
4	of homelessness, including such transgender and gender
5	non-conforming persons, Asian, Black, Latino, Native
6	American, Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, and other
7	communities of color, youth in or formerly in the foster
8	care system, veterans, and justice-system involved youth
9	and adults.
10	(c) AVAILABILITY.—Upon receipt, the Secretary shall
11	submit the report to the Congress and shall make the re-
12	port publicly available.
13	(d) Population at Higher Risk of Homeless-
14	NESS.—
15	(1) In general.—For purposes of this section,
16	the term "population at higher risk of homelessness"
17	means a group of persons that is defined by a com-
18	mon characteristic and that has been found to expe-
19	rience homelessness, housing instability, or to be
20	cost-burdened at a rate higher than that of the gen-
21	eral public.
22	(2) Higher rate.—Information that may be
23	used in demonstrating such a higher rate includes
24	data generated by the Federal Government, by State
25	or municipal governments, by peer-reviewed re-

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1	search, and by organizations having expertise in
2	working with or advocating on behalf of homeless,
3	housing unstable, or cost-burdened groups.
4	(3) Included populations.—Such term shall
5	include populations for which such higher rate has
6	already been demonstrated, including Asian, Black,
7	Latino, Native American, Native Hawaiian, Pacific
8	Islander and other communities of color; persons
9	with disabilities, including mental health disabilities,
10	elderly persons, foster and former foster youth;
11	LGBTQ persons, gender non-binary and gender non-



conforming persons, justice system-involved persons,

and veterans.
