## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118– 36

## OFFERED BY MR. KEATING OF MASSACHUSETTS

At the end of title XXXV, insert the following new section:

## 1 SECTION 35\_\_\_. UKRAINE WAR RISK INSURANCE ACT.

2 (a) WAR RISK INSURANCE ELIGIBILITY FOR CER3 TAIN COMMERCIAL VESSELS OPERATING IN UKRAINE.

4 (1)ELIGIBILITY.—Notwithstanding section 5 53902 of title 46, United States Code, for the period 6 beginning on the date of enactment of this Act, and 7 ending 5 years after such date, a covered vessel shall be deemed to be eligible for insurance or reinsurance 8 9 under chapter 539 of title 46, United States Code, 10 if such vessel is engaged in transportation in water-11 borne commerce importing cargo to, or exporting 12 cargo from, Ukraine.

13 (2) EXPANSION OF CARGO.—Subparagraphs
14 (B) through (D) of section 53903(a)(3) of title 46,
15 United States Code, shall not apply to cargo im16 ported or exported to or from Ukraine.

17 (3) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:

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1	(A) COVERED VESSEL.—The term "cov-
2	ered vessel" means a vessel that is owned by a
3	citizen of—
4	(i) a member country of the North At-
5	lantic Treaty Organization;
6	(ii) Ukraine; or
7	(iii) any other country the Secretary
8	of State, in consultation with the Secretary
9	of Transportation, determines, in the inter-
10	est of national security, shall be considered
11	eligible for insurance or reinsurance under
12	chapter 539 of title 46, United States
13	Code.
14	(B) Owned by a citizen.—The term
15	"owned by a citizen" means ownership by an
16	entity that is considered to be a citizen of a
17	country in the same manner as an entity is
18	deemed to be a citizen of the United States
19	under section 50501 of title 46, United States
20	Code.
21	(b) INSURANCE FOR UKRAINE INITIATIVE.—
22	(1) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established in
23	the Department of State an entity to be known as
24	the Insurance for Ukraine Initiative.

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1	(2) Objectives.—The objectives of the Insur-
2	ance for Ukraine Initiative are the following:
3	(A) Bolster confidence in Ukraine's even-
4	tual economic recovery from Russia's full-scale
5	invasion through the provision of war risk in-
6	surance.
7	(B) Encourage European allies and part-
8	ners to finance and invest in Ukraine's eco-
9	nomic recovery, including through the provision
10	of war risk insurance.
11	(C) Promote closer economic integration
12	between Ukraine and other countries in Europe
13	as well as the United States and further
14	Ukraine's accession to the European Union.
15	(D) Coordinate dialogue and fora for ex-
16	tensive outreach with private sector insurance
17	companies relating to the provision of war risk
18	insurance to Ukraine.
19	(E) Work with Ukraine, international or-
20	ganizations, and Middle Eastern and African
21	allies and partners to ensure the bountiful and
22	affordable shipment of grain and other food
23	commodities from Ukraine.
24	(3) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the
25	date of the enactment of this Act, and annually

1	thereafter for the following 3 years, the Secretary of
2	State shall submit to the appropriate congressional
3	committees a report that includes assessments of—
4	(A) progress towards the achievement of
5	each of the objectives set forth in subsection
6	(b); and
7	(B) legislative proposals that would further
8	the objectives set forth in paragraph (2);
9	(4) DEFINITION.—In this subsection, the term
10	"appropriate congressional committees" means—
11	(A) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of
12	the House of Representatives; and
13	(B) the Committee on Foreign Relations of
14	the Senate.
15	(c) DIPLOMATIC AND POLITICAL SUPPORT.—The
16	Secretary of State, in coordination with the heads of other
17	relevant Federal departments and agencies, shall seek to
18	provide diplomatic and political support to countries that
19	provide or provide support for war risk insurance for
20	Ukraine, including by using the diplomatic and political
21	influence and expertise of the Department of State to
22	build the capacity of such countries.

-0	(d) VOICE, VOTE, AND INFLUENCE OF THE UNITED

25 ZATION.—The Secretary of State shall direct the United

States Representative to the Food and Agriculture Orga nization of the United Nations to use the voice, vote, and
 influence of the United States at such Organization to
 seek to develop a multilateral insurance mechanism to pro tect the shipment of grain and other commodities from
 Ukraine.

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
