3	(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
4	(1) Evacuation route.—
5	(A) IN GENERAL.—The term "evacuation
6	route" means a route that—
7	(i) is owned, operated, or maintained
8	by a Federal, State, or local government or
9	a private entity;
10	(ii) is used—
11	(I) to transport the public away
12	from emergency events (as defined in
13	section 667.3 of title 23, Code of Fed-
14	eral Regulations (or successor regula-
15	tions)); or
16	(II) to transport emergency re-
17	sponders and recovery resources; and

1	(iii) is designated by the State in
2	which the route is located for the purposes
3	described in clause (ii).
4	(B) Inclusion.—The term "evacuation
5	route" includes an eligible project under sub-
6	section (d).
7	(2) Program.—The term "program" means
8	the competitive grant program established under
9	subsection $(b)(1)$ .
10	(3) Resilience project.—The term "resil-
11	ience project" means a project—
12	(A) with the ability to anticipate, prepare
13	for, and adapt to changing conditions and with-
14	stand, respond to, and recover rapidly from dis-
15	ruptions; and
16	(B) designed and built to address current
17	and future vulnerabilities to an evacuation
18	route due to—
19	(i) future occurrence or recurrence of
20	emergency events (as defined in section
21	667.3 of title 23, Code of Federal Regula-
22	tions (or successor regulations)) that are
23	likely to occur in the geographic area in
24	which the evacuation route is located; or

5	(4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
6	the Secretary of Transportation.
7	(b) Establishment of Program.—

11	scribed in paragraph (3)) shall establish a competi-
12	tive grant program to provide grants for resilience
13	projects that strengthen and protect evacuation
14	routes that are essential for providing and sup-
15	porting mass evacuations caused by emergency
16	events (as defined in section 667.3 of title 23, Code
17	of Federal Regulations (or successor regulations)).
18	(2) Requirements.—A grant awarded under
19	the program shall address—
20	(A) current and future vulnerabilities to an
21	evacuation route due to future occurrence or re-
22	currence of emergency events (as defined in sec-

24	tions (or successor regulations)) that are likely

14	(4) A political subdivision of a State or local

1	(f) APPLICATIONS.—To be eligible to receive a grant
2	under this section, an eligible entity shall submit to the
3	Secretary an application in such form, at such time, and
4	containing such information as the Secretary determines
5	to be necessary.
6	(g) Criteria.—In selecting resilience projects to re-
7	ceive grants under the program, the Secretary shall con-
8	sider—
9	(1) the cost of the project compared to the risk
10	of recurring damage and the cost of future repairs,
11	taking into account current and future emergency
12	events (as defined in section 667.3 of title 23, Code
13	of Federal Regulations (or successor regulations))
14	and extreme weather events, to the maximum extent
15	practicable;
16	(2) the extent to which the project reduces the
17	financial risk to the Federal Government; and
18	(3) such other criteria as the Secretary deter-
19	mines to be appropriate.
20	(h) Administration of Projects.—Responsibility
21	for oversight and administration of a project that receives
22	a grant under this section—
23	(1) may be transferred within the Department
24	of Transportation; and
25	(2) shall be administered in accordance with—

1	(A) title 23 and title 49, United States
2	Code, as applicable;

13	not exceed 80 percent of the total project cost.
14	(2) Non-federal share.—The eligible entity
15	may use funds provided from other Federal sources
16	to meet the non-Federal cost share requirement for
17	a project under the program.
18	(j) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
19	authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section for
20	each fiscal year \$1,000,000,000, to remain available until
21	expended.
