(B) the protection of civilians and other protected persons and objects, in addition to a legal obligation and a strategic interest, is a moral and ethical imperative;

8 (C) despite those commitments, military 9 operations of the United States and partner 10 countries during the two decades before the 11 date of the enactment of this Act have resulted 12 in civilian deaths and injuries, and damage to 13 or destruction of civilian objects including crit-14 ical infrastructure, in at least Afghanistan, 15 Iraq, Pakistan, Somalia, Syria, and Yemen; and

16 (D) more must be done to improve the pro-17 tection of civilians;

18 (3) that the Department has submitted to Con-19 gress four successive annual reports on civilian cas-20 ualties resulting from United States military operations for calendar years 2017, 2018, 2019, and 21 22 2020, and has updated reports as appropriate; and 23 (4) to recognize the efforts of the Department, 24 both in policy and in practice, to reduce the harm 25 to civilians and other protected persons and objects 3

resulting from United States military operations,
 and to encourage the Department to make addi tional progress in—

4 (A) developing at all combatant commands 5 personnel and offices responsible for advising 6 the commanders of such commands, and inte-7 grating into command strategy, the promotion 8 of observance of human rights and the protec-9 tion of civilians and other protected persons 10 and objects;

(B) finalizing and implementing the policy
of the Department relating to civilian casualties
resulting from United States military operations, as required by section 936 of the John
S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act
for Fiscal Year 2019 (Public Law 115–232; 10
U.S.C. 134 note);

18 (C) finalizing and implementing Depart-19 ment-wide regulations to implement section 20 1213 of the National Defense Authorization for 21 Fiscal Year 2020 (Public Law 116–92; 10 22 U.S.C. 2731 note), for ex gratia payments for 23 damage, personal injury, or death that is inci-24 dent to the use of force by the United States Armed Forces, a coalition that includes the 25

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United States, a military organization sup porting the United States, or a military organi zation supporting the United States or such co alition; and

(D) professionalizing foreign partner forces to minimize, mitigate, and respond to harm to civilians, including in connection with arms transfers, train and equip programs, advise, assist, accompany, and enable missions, and fully combined and coalition operations.

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
