 procedures, and practices, and monitor and assess
 implementation of lessons learned;

8 "(c) DIRECTOR.—(1) There is a Director of the Cen-9 ter, who shall be the head of the Center, and who shall 10 be appointed by the Secretary of Defense. The Director 11 of the Center shall be a civilian with significant experience 12 and expertise relating to the protection of civilians.

14 "(A) report directly to the Secretary of De-15 fense; and

16 "(B) carry out the functions of the Center17 under subsection (b).

18 "(d) STAFF.—The Center shall have sufficient staff
