1 SEC. 12____. REPORT ON US MILITARY SUPPORT OF THE 2 SAUDI-LED COALITION IN YEMEN.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the
4 date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General
5 of the United States shall submit to the appropriate com6 mittees of Congress a report that includes—

7 (1) a description of the military support, train8 ing, and defense articles provided by the Department
9 of Defense to Saudi Arabia, the Government of the
10 United Arab Emirates, and other countries partici11 pating in the Saudi-led coalition since March 2015,
12 including—

(A) an annual description, by fiscal year or
calendar year, of all transfers of logistics support, supplies, defense articles, and services
under sections 2341 and 2342 of title 10,
United States Code, or any other applicable
law;

(B) a description of the total financialvalue of such transfers and which countries

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bore the cost described in subparagraph (A) of these transfers, including the status of the reimbursement of costs from Saudi Arabia, the Government of the United Arab Emirates and the Saudi-led coalition to the Department of Defense; and

7 (C) a description of the types of training 8 provided by the Department of Defense, includ-9 ing the authorities under which this training 10 was provided, and whether such training has in-11 cluded tactics for stopping, searching and seiz-12 ing boats, or other activities that could be used to restrict the importation of commercial and 13 14 humanitarian shipments into and out of Yemen; 15 (2) a description and evaluation of processes 16 used by the Department of Defense to determine 17 whether the types of military support described in 18 paragraph (1)(A) have impacted the restriction of 19 the movement of persons into or out of Yemen, the 20 restriction of the importation of commercial and hu-21 manitarian shipments into and out of Yemen, or the 22 illicit profit from such importation by any of the 23 warring parties in the conflict in Yemen;

24 (3) a description and evaluation of processes25 used by the Department of Defense to determine

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whether the type of military support described in
paragraph (1)(C) has been use by any of the warring parties in the conflict in Yemen to restrict the
importation of commercial and humanitarian shipments into and out of Yemen; and

6 (4) a description and evaluation of processes 7 used by the Department of Defense to determine 8 what steps the Department has taken to reduce re-9 strictions on the movement of persons into or out of 10 Yemen, and restrictions on the importation of com-11 mercial and humanitarian shipments into and out of 12 Yemen, or the illicit profit of such importation by 13 any of the warring parties in the conflict in Yemen. 14 (b) FORM.—The report required by subsection (a) 15 shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may include a classified annex. 16

17 (c) APPROPRIATE COMMITTEES OF CONGRESS.—In
18 this section, the term "appropriate committees of Con19 gress" means—

20 (1) the Committee on Armed Services, the
21 Committee on Foreign Affairs, the Permanent Select
22 Committee on Intelligence, and the Committee on
23 Financial Services of the House of Representatives;

(2) the Committee on Armed Services, the
 Committee on Foreign Relations, the Select Com mittee on Intelligence, and the Committee on Bank ing, Housing, and Urban Affairs of the Senate.

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
