## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119-8 OFFERED BY MRS. KIGGANS OF VIRGINIA

At the end of subtitle E of title III, add at the end the following new section:

1	SEC. 3 REPORT ON REDUCING FREQUENCY OF PERMA-
2	NENT CHANGES OF STATION AND NAVAL VES-
3	SEL TO ONSHORE ROTATIONS.
4	(a) Report Required.—Not later than March 1,
5	2026, the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and
6	Readiness, in coordination with the Secretaries of the mili-
7	tary departments, shall submit to the congressional de-
8	fense committees a report on options to reduce the fre-
9	quency of permanent changes of station of members of the
10	Armed Forces and the rotations of such members between
11	assignments to naval vessels and onshore assignments
12	(commonly referred to as "sea-shore rotations").
13	(b) Elements.—The report under subsection (a)
14	shall include the following:
15	(1) An analysis of the costs associated with the
16	permanent changes of station and rotations specified
17	in subsection (a), disaggregated by military depart-
18	ment and occupational specialty, over the five fiscal
19	years preceding the date of the report.

1	(2) An assessment of the potential cost savings
2	of the Department of Defense to be realized through
3	a reduction in the frequency of such permanent
4	changes of station and rotations.
5	(3) An evaluation of the effects of a reduction
6	in such frequency on retention of members of the
7	Armed Forces, employment for the spouses of such
8	members, and education of the children of such
9	members.
10	(4) An identification of billets, duty stations
11	and communities with respect to which extended
12	tour lengths or rotation adjustments would be oper-
13	ationally feasible while sustaining mission readiness
14	and career progression requirements.
15	(5) Recommendations for any legislative or pol-
16	icy changes necessary to conduct a pilot program
17	for, or otherwise implement, extensions to tour
18	lengths or rotation adjustments.
