## AMENDMENT TO THE RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119–8

## OFFERED BY MRS. KIGGANS OF VIRGINIA

At the end of subtitle A of title VII, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 7 IMPROVEMENTS TO THE TRICARE PHARMACY
2	BENEFITS PROGRAM.
3	(a) Fair and Transparent TRICARE Pharmacy
4	Reimbursement.—
5	(1) Minimum Pharmacy reimbursement
6	STANDARDS.—Section 1074g of title 10, United
7	States Code, is amended—
8	(A) by redesignating subsection (j) as sub-
9	section (m); and
10	(B) by inserting after subsection (i) the
11	following:
12	"(j) Pharmacy Benefit Manager Reimburse-
13	MENT STANDARDS.—
14	"(1) In General.—The Secretary of Defense
15	shall ensure that under any contract entered into for
16	the administration of the TRICARE pharmacy bene-
17	fits program—

1	"(A) reimbursement to retail pharmacies
2	shall, at a minimum, cover the ingredient cost
3	to acquire such medications from wholesalers,
4	at a rate that is not lower the national average
5	drug acquisition cost for the drug on the day of
6	claim adjudication (or, in the case of a drug
7	that does not appear on the national average
8	drug acquisition cost index, the wholesale acqui-
9	sition cost for such prescription drug), plus a
10	reasonable professional dispensing fee;
11	"(B) the contractor may not impose point-
12	of-sale fees, retroactive fees, or other indirect or
13	hidden fees that reduce reimbursement below
14	the level described in subparagraph (A); and
15	"(C) failure by the contractor to comply
16	with this subsection shall result in the suspen-
17	sion of contract payments until the contractor
18	demonstrates compliance to the satisfaction of
19	the Secretary.
20	"(2) Enforcement.—Notwithstanding any
21	other provision of law, if the Secretary determines
22	that a TRICARE pharmacy benefit manager for the
23	TRICARE pharmacy benefit program has failed to
24	meet the requirements of paragraph (1), the Sec-
25	retary shall withhold funds appropriated for the ad-

1	ministration of the contract until corrective actions
2	are taken to stabilize pharmacy payment rates and
3	dispensing fees, or re-issue the TPharm5 contract
4	for bids from additional transparent pharmacy ben-
5	efit managers.".
6	(b) Strengthening Oversight of the TRICARE
7	Pharmacy Program.—Section 1074g of title 10, United
8	States Code, as amended by subsection (a), is further
9	amended by inserting after subsection (j) the following:
10	"(k) Independent Audits.—The Secretary of De-
11	fense shall provide for independent audits, conducted not
12	less frequently than annually, of data reported by a phar-
13	macy benefit manager relating to reimbursement rates,
14	fees, price concessions, pharmacy network adequacy, and
15	beneficiary access. Such audits shall be submitted to the
16	Committees on Armed Services of the Senate and the
17	House of Representatives.
18	"(l) Access Metrics.—In conducting oversight of
19	the TRICARE pharmacy benefit program, the Secretary
20	shall ensure that measures of access include—
21	"(1) continuity of care and beneficiary pref-
22	erence, including the ability of beneficiaries to re-
23	main with their pharmacy of choice; and

1	"(2) meaningful geographic access standards
2	beyond drive-time calculations, with special consider-
3	ation for rural and underserved areas.".
4	(c) Protecting Patient Choice; Prohibition on
5	Mandatory Mail Order.—Section 1074g(a)(9) of title
6	10, United States Code, is amended—
7	(1) in subparagraph (A), by striking "2015"
8	and inserting "2026"; and
9	(2) by adding at the end the following:
10	"(D) A beneficiary under this section shall have
11	the right to choose any network retail pharmacy for
12	receipt of prescription drugs, and shall not be com-
13	pelled to use mail order pharmacies or pharmacies
14	owned, affiliated, or controlled by a pharmacy ben-
15	efit manager or its corporate affiliates, if the bene-
16	ficiary elects to use a retail pharmacy that is willing
17	to participate on terms that comply with subsection
18	(j).".
