## AMENDMENT TO H. CON. RES. 96 OFFERED BY MR. KINZINGER OF ILLINOIS

At the end of title VI, add the following new section (and amend the table of contents accordingly):

I	SEC POLICY STATEMENT ON TRANSPARENCY OF MAN-
2	DATORY SPENDING.
3	The House finds the following:
4	(1) Since 1965, mandatory spending as a share
5	of the Federal budget has doubled. Currently, man-
6	datory spending represents 60 percent of Federal
7	spending and, according to the Congressional Budg-
8	et Office, is estimated to reach 72 percent of Fed-
9	eral spending by 2035.
10	(2) A bipartisan solution has been introduced in
11	the House—H.R. 2518, the Truth in Spending
12	Act—to inject transparency into new mandatory
13	spending programs and create new mechanisms to
14	control costs in programs that spend in excess of
15	their Congressional Budget Office estimates.
16	(3) It is the policy of this resolution that Con-
17	gress should work on a bipartisan basis to increase
18	transparency of mandatory spending bills and estab-

- lish spending triggers to increase accountability of
- 2 mandatory spending programs.
