

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119-

OFFERED BY MR. KRISHNAMOORTHY OF ILLINOIS

At the end of subtitle E of title X, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 10___. REPORT ON UNITED STATES FORCE POSTURE**
2 **AND ALLY AND PARTNER CONFIDENCE IN**
3 **THE INDO-PACIFIC REGION.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 120 days after the
5 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of De-
6 fense, in coordination with Commander of the United
7 States Indo-Pacific Command and the Secretary of State,
8 shall submit to the congressional defense committees and
9 the congressional intelligence committees a report on the
10 confidence of allies and partners of the United States in
11 United States security commitments following any reduc-
12 tion, withdrawal, or repositioning of United States Armed
13 Forces and equipment in the Indo-Pacific region after
14 January 2026.

15 (b) ELEMENTS.—The report required under sub-
16 section (a) shall include each of the following:

17 (1) A description of any public or private state-
18 ments by officials of regional allies and partners of

1 the United States, including Japan, the Republic of
2 Korea, Taiwan, the Philippines, and Australia, ex-
3 pressing concern or confidence regarding the reduc-
4 tion, withdrawal, or repositioning of United States
5 Armed Forces and equipment in the Indo-Pacific re-
6 gion after January 2026, and an assessment of the
7 effect of such reductions, withdrawals, and repositi-
8 tionings on the confidence of allies and partners of
9 the United States in extended deterrence and secu-
10 rity commitments of the United States.

11 (2) A determination of whether United States
12 force posture, basing locations, and activities con-
13 tinue to sufficiently deter threats to allies and part-
14 ners, including Japan, the Republic of Korea, Tai-
15 wan, the Philippines, and Australia.

16 (3) A description of the operational and stra-
17 tegic conditions informing decisions to reduce, with-
18 draw, or reposition United States Armed Forces and
19 equipment in the Indo-Pacific region.

20 (4) A determination of whether any changes in
21 United States posture have resulted in any shifts in
22 defense spending, capability investment, or willing-
23 ness to expand basing and access agreements with
24 the United States by allies and partners of the
25 United States.

1 (5) A description of any changes the Depart-
2 ment of Defense has implemented or plans to imple-
3 ment to preserve ally and partner confidence in
4 United States extended deterrence and security com-
5 mitments.

6 (6) A description of the posture of the Armed
7 Forces in the Indo-Pacific region, as of the date of
8 the submission of the report, and levels of engage-
9 ment by the United States Armed Forces with re-
10 gional allies and partners, including how any
11 planned posture changes would affect United States
12 engagement with partner forces in Japan, the Re-
13 public of Korea, Taiwan, the Philippines, and Aus-
14 tralia.

15 (c) FORM.—The report required under subsection (a)
16 shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may contain
17 a classified annex.

18 (d) CONGRESSIONAL INTELLIGENCE COMMITTEES
19 DEFINED.—In this section, the term “congressional intel-
20 ligence committees” has the meaning given such term in
21 section 3 of the National Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C.
22 3003)).
