Insert after section 543 the following new section:

1	SEC. 5 POLICIES AND PROCEDURES ON REGISTRATION
2	AT MILITARY INSTALLATIONS OF CIVIL PRO-
3	TECTION ORDERS APPLICABLE TO MEMBERS
4	OF THE ARMED FORCES ASSIGNED TO SUCH
5	INSTALLATIONS AND CERTAIN OTHER INDI-
6	VIDUALS.
7	(a) Policies and Procedures Required.—Not
8	later than one year after the date of the enactment of this
9	Act, the Secretary of Defense shall, in consultation with
10	the Secretaries of the military departments, establish poli-
11	cies and procedures for the registration at military instal-
12	lations of any civil protection orders described in sub-
13	section (b), including the duties and responsibilities of
14	commanders of installations in the registration process.
15	(b) CIVIL PROTECTION ORDERS.—A civil protection
16	order described in this subsection is any civil protective
17	order as follows:

1	(1) A civil protection order against a member of
2	the Armed Forces assigned to the installation con-
3	cerned.
4	(2) A civil protection order against a civilian
5	employee employed at the installation concerned.
6	(3) A civil protection order against the civilian
7	spouse or intimate partner of a member of the
8	Armed Forces on active duty and assigned to the in-
9	stallation concerned, or of a civilian employee de-
10	scribed in paragraph (2), which order provides for
11	the protection of such member or employee.
12	(c) Particular Elements.—The policies and pro-
13	cedures required by subsection (a) shall include the fol-
14	lowing:
15	(1) A requirement for notice between and
16	among the commander, military law enforcement ele-
17	ments, and military criminal investigative elements
18	of an installation when a member of the Armed
19	Forces assigned to such installation, a civilian em-
20	ployee employed at such installation, a civilian
21	spouse or intimate partner of a member assigned to
22	such installation, or a civilian spouse or intimate
23	partner of a civilian employee employed at such in-
24	stallation becomes subject to a civil protection order.

(2) A statement of policy that failure to register
a civil protection order may not be a justification for
the lack of enforcement of such order by military
law enforcement and other applicable personnel who
have knowledge of such order.
(d) Letter.—As soon as practicable after estab-
lishing the policies and procedures required by subsection
(a), the Secretary shall submit to the Committees on
Armed Services of the Senate and the House of Represent-
atives a letter that includes the following:
(1) A detailed description of the policies and
procedures.
(2) A certification by the Secretary that the
policies and procedures have been implemented on
each military installation.
