Amendment to Rules Committee Print 118–11 Offered by Mr. LaMalfa of California

At the end of title VIII, add the following:

1 SEC. . WILDFIRE SUPPRESSION.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—To ensure that sufficient fire-3 fighting resources are available to suppress wildfires and 4 protect public safety and property, and notwithstanding 5 any other provision of law or agency regulation, not later than 18 months after the date of enactment of this sec-6 tion, the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Adminis-7 tration shall promulgate an interim final rule under 8 9 which---

10 (1)operation described in section an 11 21.25(b)(7) of title 14, Code of Federal Regulations, 12 shall allow for the transport of firefighters to and 13 from the site of a wildfire to perform ground wildfire 14 suppression and designate the firefighters con-15 ducting such an operation as essential crewmembers 16 on board a covered aircraft operated on a mission to 17 suppress wildfire;

18 (2) the aircraft maintenance, inspections, and19 pilot training requirements under part 135 of such

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title 14 may apply to such an operation, if deter mined by the Administrator to be necessary to main tain the safety of firefighters carrying out wildfire
 suppression missions; and

5 (3) the noise standards described in part 36 of 6 such title 14 shall not apply to such an operation. 7 (b) SURPLUS MILITARY AIRCRAFT.—In promul-8 gating any rule under subsection (a), the Administrator 9 shall not enable any aircraft of a type that has been manu-10 factured in accordance with the requirements of and accepted for use by any branch of the United States Military 11 12 and has been later modified to be used for wildfire sup-13 pression operations, unless such aircraft is later type-rated by the Administrator. 14

(c) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS TO FAA DOCUMENTS.—In promulgating an interim final rule under subsection (a), the Administrator shall amend FAA Order
8110.56, Restricted Category Type Certification (dated
February 27, 2006), as well as any corresponding policy
or guidance material, to reflect the requirements of subsection (a).

(d) SAVINGS PROVISION.—Nothing in this section
shall be construed to limit the Administrator's authority
to take action otherwise authorized by law to protect aviation safety or passenger safety.

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1 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

2 (1) COVERED AIRCRAFT.—The term "covered 3 aircraft" means an aircraft type-certificated in the 4 restricted category under section 21.25 of title 14, 5 Code of Federal Regulations, used for transporting firefighters to and from the site of a wildfire in 6 7 order to perform ground wildfire suppression for the purpose of extinguishing a wildfire on behalf of, or 8 9 pursuant to a contract with, a Federal, State, or 10 local government agency.

(2) FIREFIGHTERS.—The term "firefighters"
means a trained fire suppression professional the
transport of whom is necessary to accomplish a wildfire suppression operation.

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
