

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 8790, AS REPORTED  
OFFERED BY MR. LAMALFA OF CALIFORNIA**

At the end of the bill add the following:

**1 TITLE IV—COMBUSTION AVOID-**  
**2 ANCE ALONG RURAL ROADS**

**3 SEC. 401. EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN WILDFIRE MITIGATION**  
**4 ACTIVITIES FROM CERTAIN ENVIRONMENTAL**  
**5 REQUIREMENTS.**

**6 (a) IN GENERAL.**—Wildfire mitigation activities of  
**7 the Secretary concerned may be carried out without re-**  
**8 gard to the provisions of law specified in subsection (b).**

**9 (b) PROVISIONS OF LAW SPECIFIED.**—The provisions  
**10 of law specified in this section are all Federal, State, or**  
**11 other laws, regulations, and legal requirements of, deriving**  
**12 from, or related to the subject of, the following laws:**

**13 (1) Section 102(2)(C) of the National Environ-**  
**14 mental Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4332(2)(C)).**

**15 (2) The Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16**  
**16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).**

**17 (c) WILDFIRE MITIGATION ACTIVITY.**—For purposes  
**18 of this section, the term “wildfire mitigation activity”—**

**19 (1) is an activity conducted on Federal land**  
**20 that is—**

1 (A) under the administration of the Direc-  
2 tor of the National Park System, the Director  
3 of the Bureau of Land Management, or the  
4 Chief of the Forest Service; and

5 (B) within 300 feet of any permanent or  
6 temporary road, as measured from the center of  
7 such road; and

8 (2) includes forest thinning, hazardous fuel re-  
9 duction, prescribed burning, and vegetation manage-  
10 ment.
