

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 117-

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OFFERED BY MR. LAMBORN OF COLORADO

At the end of subtitle F of title X, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 10___. REPORT ON ANTI-PERSONNEL LANDMINE MU-**
2 **NITIONS.**

3 (a) REPORT REQUIRED.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
5 enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense shall
6 submit to the congressional defense committees a re-
7 port that includes each of the following:

8 (A) A description of the policy of the De-
9 partment of Defense regarding the use of anti-
10 personnel landmine munitions, including meth-
11 ods for commanders to seek waivers to use such
12 munitions.

13 (B) A ten-year projection of the inventory
14 levels for all anti-personnel landmine munitions
15 that takes into account future production of
16 anti-personnel landmine munitions, any plans
17 for demilitarization of such munitions, the age
18 of the munitions, storage and safety consider-

1 ations, and other factors that will impact the
2 size of the inventory.

3 (C) A ten-year projection for the cost to
4 achieve the inventory levels projected in sub-
5 paragraph (B), including the cost for potential
6 demilitarization or disposal of such munitions.

7 (D) A ten-year projection for the cost to
8 develop and produce new anti-personnel land-
9 mine munitions the Secretary determines are
10 necessary to meet the demands of current oper-
11 ational plans.

12 (E) The assessment of the Chairman of
13 the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the combatant
14 commanders of the effects of the projected anti-
15 personnel landmine inventory on current oper-
16 ational plans.

17 (F) Any other matters that the Secretary
18 determines should be included in the report.

19 (2) FORM OF REPORT.—The report required by
20 paragraph (1) shall be submitted in unclassified
21 form, but may include a classified annex.

22 (b) BRIEFING REQUIRED.—

23 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days
24 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
25 retary of Defense shall provide to the congressional

1 defense committees a briefing on the current state of
2 research and development into operational alter-
3 natives to anti-personnel landmine munitions.

4 (2) FORM OF BRIEFING.—The briefing required
5 by paragraph (1) may contain classified information.

6 (c) ANTI-PERSONNEL LANDMINE MUNITIONS DE-
7 FINED.—In this section, the term “anti-personnel land-
8 mine munitions” includes antipersonnel landmines and
9 sub-munitions as defined by the Convention on the Prohi-
10 bition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer
11 of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction, as de-
12 termined by the Secretary.
