At the end of the bill add the following:

6 (a) REPORTS REQUIRED.—

7 (1) INITIAL REPORT.—Not later than six
8 months after the date of the enactment of this Act,
9 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall submit to the
10 Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and
11 House of Representatives a report on WARTAC.

(2) ANNUAL REPORT.—One year after the submission under paragraph (1) and annually thereafter, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall submit
to such Committees a report that contains the elements under paragraphs (1) and (3) of subsection
(b) with regards to the preceding year.

(b) ELEMENTS.—Subject to subsection (a)(2), the reports under this section shall include the following elements:

1	(1) BEST PRACTICES.—With regards to best

3	(A) how many covered members have ap-
