

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119-

OFFERED BY MR. LANDSMAN OF OHIO

Add at the end of subtitle B of title XVII the following:

1 **SEC. 17__ . EXTRAORDINARY PROTECTION REIMBURSE-**
2 **MENT PROGRAM ESTABLISHED.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Homeland Secu-
4 rity shall establish a program to be known as the Extraor-
5 dinary Protection Reimbursement Program to provide
6 grants to reimburse State, local, Tribal, and territorial
7 governments for protection activities directly and demon-
8 strably associated with the non-governmental properties as
9 designated in the Presidential Protection Assistance Act
10 of 1976 of persons protected pursuant to paragraphs (1),
11 (3), (7), and (8) of section 3056 of title 18, United States
12 Code.

13 (b) ELIGIBILITY.—To be eligible for a grant under
14 the program, an applicant shall—

15 (1) be a State, local, Tribal, or territorial law
16 enforcement agency; and

17 (2) certify that the grant will be used only for
18 costs incurred in excess of typical law enforcement

1 operation costs that are directly attributable to the
2 provision of protection as described in subsection
3 (d).

4 (c) USE OF FUNDS.—Grants distributed under this
5 section on a reimbursable basis may be used only in ac-
6 cordance with the following:

7 (1) In the case of amounts expended on costs
8 pertaining to personnel, grant amounts may only be
9 expended for man-hours spent directly on protection
10 of a non-governmental property, including patrols
11 dedicated to the area immediately surrounding the
12 residence or office and officers otherwise posted to
13 protection of the property.

14 (2) In the case of amounts expended on equip-
15 ment, grant amounts may only be expended—

16 (A) for the explicit purpose of protection of
17 a property; and

18 (B) the Director of the United States Se-
19 cret Service shall certify the need for the grant-
20 ee to acquire equipment for the protection of
21 the property and travel to and from the prop-
22 erty.

23 (3) Grant amounts may only be expended on
24 protection provided while the protected person is

1 physically present at, or traveling to or from, the
2 property.

3 (d) LIMITATION ON OBLIGATION.—Not later than
4 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-
5 retary of Homeland Security shall submit a report to Com-
6 mittee on Homeland Security of the House of Representa-
7 tives, the Committee on Homeland Security and Govern-
8 mental Affairs of the Senate, the Committee on Appro-
9 priations of the House of Representatives, and the Com-
10 mittee on Appropriations of the Senate a report on the
11 implementation of the recommendations included in the
12 report of the Inspector General of the Department of
13 Homeland Security, dated July 28, 2023. The Secretary
14 of Homeland Security shall thereafter ensure future imple-
15 mentation of each such recommendation.

16 (e) ACCOUNTABILITY.—

17 (1) INSPECTOR GENERAL AUDIT.—The Inspec-
18 tor General of the Department of Homeland Secu-
19 rity shall carry out an audit of the program under
20 this section each fiscal year and may carry out such
21 other inspections of the program as the Inspector
22 General determines appropriate. The Inspector Gen-
23 eral shall submit a report on such audit by not later
24 than 90 days after the first date of the following fis-
25 cal year to the Committee on Appropriations of the

1 House of Representatives and the Committee on Ap-
2 propriations of the Senate.

3 (2) ANNUAL REPORT.—The Secretary of Home-
4 land Security shall submit a report for each fiscal
5 year grants are made to the Committee on Home-
6 land Security of the House of Representatives and
7 to the Committee on Homeland Security and Gov-
8 ernmental Affairs of the Senate that includes—

9 (A) the total amount of grants disbursed
10 that fiscal year; and

11 (B) for each grantee—

12 (i) the identity of the grantee;

13 (ii) the amount of the grant;

14 (iii) the total man-hours spent on pro-
15 tection of a property by the grantee; and

16 (iv) an itemized list of all equipment
17 acquired using the grant, including the cer-
18 tification referred to in subsection

19 (c)(2)(B) for that equipment.

20 (f) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act, the term “non-gov-
21 ernmental property”—

22 (1) means any non-governmental, owned or
23 leased, property designated for protection by the
24 United States Secret Service; and

1 (2) does not include any hotel or other place of
2 temporary accommodation of less than 30 days.

3 (g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
4 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this Act
5 \$61,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2027, 2028, and
6 2029. Administration of these funds shall be executed by
7 the Department’s Management Directorate or Federal
8 Emergency Management Agency, as directed by the Sec-
9 retary, in coordination with the Secret Service as appro-
10 prium.
