Page 68, after line 11, insert the following new section:

1	SEC POLICY OF THE HOUSE ON DOMESTIC POVERTY.
2	(a) FINDINGS.—The House finds that—
3	(1) Members of Congress rely upon the exper-
4	tise of the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) to
5	properly allocate the trillions of dollars entrusted to
6	the Congress by the American people;
7	(2) Members of Congress must be fully in-
8	formed to correctly set the funding levels for the
9	programs that protect our most vulnerable popu-
10	lations and serve the critical needs of Americans who
11	live below the poverty line, or are near poverty, and
12	efficiently and effectively allocating those funds to
13	provide the greatest benefit to our Nation's vulner-
14	able communities is critical to our future success as
15	a Nation and as a growing economy;
16	(3) funding that provides the vital supports
17	which protect Americans from the deprivations of
18	poverty and provide the support, education and tech-
19	nical assistance that millions of Americans need to

1	lift themselves out of poverty are spread all across
2	the entire Federal Government and in different
3	budget functions and different appropriations juris-
4	dictions;
5	(4) Members of Congress would be helped by an
6	official consolidated picture of how our budgeting
7	process is impacting our Nation's most vulnerable
8	populations; and
9	(5) the CBO is uniquely qualified to generate
10	an independent, thorough and non-partisan report
11	which would organize the complex web of programs
12	and tax expenditures that are meant to meet the
13	needs of families who are poor or near poor and
14	would allow Members to more easily gather critical
15	insight on how budgets will impact the rates of pov-
16	erty and the lives of those who are living in poverty
17	or are near poor.
18	(b) Policy.—It is the policy of this resolution that
19	the Congressional Budget Office shall—
20	(1) generate a separate analysis, in conjunction
21	with their work on the majority and minority budg-
22	ets, which identifies and organizes all of the funding
23	levels for the Federal programs or tax expenditures
24	and credits which impact the benefits and services
25	that meet the basic human needs of Americans in

1	poverty and near poverty or are meant to provide a
2	pathway out of poverty like job training programs or
3	educational grants for low income students;
4	(2) produce a detailed, separate analysis for the
5	prior fiscal year, the current fiscal year, the fiscal
6	year for which the budget is submitted, and the en-
7	suing fiscal year identifying the amounts of gross
8	and net appropriations or obligational authority and
9	outlays that are directed to Americans who are poor
10	and near poor, within the United States and terri-
11	tories including detailed individual reports on the
12	specific programs which are directed towards the
13	needs of programs that impact—
14	(A) the rates of poverty and near poverty
15	nationally;
16	(B) children in poverty and near poverty;
17	(C) seniors in poverty and near poverty;
18	(D) disabled Americans in poverty and
19	near poverty; and
20	(E) veterans in poverty and near poverty;
21	and
22	(3) consult periodically with the Committees on
23	the Budget of the Senate and the House of Rep-
24	resentatives, the Committees on Appropriations of
25	the Senate and the House of Representatives, and

the Office of Management and Budget in developing this budget document, including determining what Federal activities or accounts constitutes spending and tax expenditures on poverty and near poverty programs.
