

**AMENDMENT TO THE RULES COMMITTEE PRINT**  
**117-13**  
**OFFERED BY MR. LYNCH OF MASSACHUSETTS**

In title LI, add at the end the following:

1 **SEC. 5106. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL.**

2 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-  
3 ings:

4 (1) On September 11, 2012, the United States  
5 consulate, and its personnel in Benghazi, Libya,  
6 were attacked by militants.

7 (2) Four Americans were killed in the attack,  
8 including Ambassador J. Christopher Stevens, Sean  
9 Smith, Glen Doherty, and Tyrone Woods.

10 (3) Glen Doherty and Tyrone Woods were  
11 former Navy SEALs who served as security per-  
12 sonnel in Libya. As the attack unfolded, they bravely  
13 attempted to defend American property and protect  
14 United States diplomatic personnel. In so doing,  
15 they selflessly sacrificed their own lives.

16 (4) Glen Doherty was a Navy SEAL for 12  
17 years and served in Iraq and Afghanistan. He at-  
18 tained the rank of Petty Officer First Class and  
19 earned the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation

1 Medal. After leaving the Navy, Glen Doherty worked  
2 with the Department of State to protect American  
3 diplomats.

4 (5) Tyrone Woods served for 20 years as a  
5 Navy SEAL including tours in Iraq and Afghani-  
6 stan. In Iraq he led multiple raids and reconnais-  
7 sance missions and earned the Bronze Star. After  
8 retiring from the Navy as a Senior Chief Petty Offi-  
9 cer, Tyrone Woods worked with the Department of  
10 State to protect American diplomats.

11 (6) J. Christopher Stevens served for 21 years  
12 in the U.S. Foreign Service. He was serving as U.S.  
13 Ambassador to Libya and previously served twice in  
14 the country, as both Special Representative to the  
15 Libyan Transitional National Council and as the  
16 Deputy Chief of Mission. Earlier in his life, he also  
17 served as a Peace Corps volunteer teaching English  
18 in Morocco.

19 (7) Sean Smith served for 6 years in the U.S.  
20 Air Force. He attained the rank of Staff Sergeant  
21 and was awarded the Air Force Commendation  
22 Medal. After leaving the Air Force, Sean Smith  
23 served for 10 years in the State Department on var-  
24 ious assignments, which took him to places such as  
25 Baghdad, Brussels, Pretoria, and The Hague.

1           (8) As their careers attest, all four men served  
2 their country honorably.

3           (b) CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL.—

4           (1) AWARD AUTHORIZED.—The Speaker of the  
5 House of Representatives and the President pro  
6 tempore of the Senate shall make appropriate ar-  
7 rangements for the posthumous award, on behalf of  
8 the Congress, of a single gold medal of appropriate  
9 design collectively in commemoration of Glen  
10 Doherty, Tyrone Woods, J. Christopher Stevens, and  
11 Sean Smith, in recognition of their contributions to  
12 the Nation.

13           (2) DESIGN AND STRIKING.—For the purposes  
14 of the award referred to in paragraph (1), the Sec-  
15 retary of the Treasury (hereafter in this section re-  
16 ferred to as the “Secretary”) shall strike the gold  
17 medal with suitable emblems, devices, and inscrip-  
18 tions, to be determined by the Secretary. The Sec-  
19 retary is authorized to create designs for the medal  
20 that, if the Secretary deems it appropriate, include  
21 images of, and inscriptions of the names of, Glen  
22 Doherty, Tyrone Woods, J. Christopher Stevens, and  
23 Sean Smith.

24           (3) CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY MU-  
25 SEUM.—

1           (A) IN GENERAL.—Following the award of  
2           the gold medal under paragraph (1), the gold  
3           medal shall be given to the Central Intelligence  
4           Agency Museum, where it shall be displayed as  
5           appropriate and made available for research.

6           (B) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense  
7           of Congress that the Central Intelligence Agen-  
8           cy Museum should make the gold medal re-  
9           ceived under subparagraph (A) available for  
10          display elsewhere, particularly at other appro-  
11          priate locations associated with Glen Doherty,  
12          Tyrone Woods, J. Christopher Stevens, and  
13          Sean Smith.

14          (c) DUPLICATE MEDALS.—Under such regulations as  
15          the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary may strike and  
16          sell duplicates in bronze of the gold medal struck under  
17          subsection (b), at a price sufficient to cover the costs of  
18          the medals, including labor, materials, dies, use of machin-  
19          ery, and overhead expenses.

20          (d) NATIONAL MEDALS.—Medals struck pursuant to  
21          this section are national medals for purposes of chapter  
22          51 of title 31, United States Code.
