Amendment to Rules Comm. Print 117–13 Offered by Mrs. Lesko of Arizona

Add at the end of subtitle E of title XII of division A the following:

1 SEC. 12____. REPORT ON UNITED STATES-TAIWAN SEMICON 2 DUCTOR WORKING GROUP.

3 (a) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con4 gress that—

5 (1) it is the common interest of the United
6 States and allies and partners to strive for a Indo7 Pacific region that is free, open, inclusive, healthy,
8 anchored by democratic values and market-based
9 rules;

(2) the United States should work closely with
allies and partners to respond to the most urgent of
global challenges, including economic and health impacts of COVID, economic recovery as well as supply
chain resiliency of critical industries;

(3) Taiwan is a vital part of global high technology supply chain with top-notched manufacturing
capacity for chips; and it is in the political, security
and economic interests of the United States to advo-

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cate for an upgraded partnership with Taiwan in re sponse to challenges due to shortage of chips; and
 (4) the United States recognizes Taiwan's con tinued efforts to expand production of critical chips,
 including for auto industries impacted severely by
 COVID.

7 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
8 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense,
9 in coordination with Secretary of Commerce, the Secretary
10 of State, and the heads of other appropriate Federal de11 partments and agencies, shall submit to the appropriate
12 congressional committees a report on the following:

(1) The feasibility and advisability of establishing an inter-agency United States-Taiwan working group for coordinating cooperation related to
semiconductor issues.

17 (2) A discussion of current and future plans to
18 engage with Taiwan with respect to activities ensur19 ing supply chain security, especially with respect to
20 semiconductors.

21 (3) An assessment of impacts on global supply
22 chain integrity in case of regional conflicts in the
23 Taiwan Strait.

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1	(4) An assessment to achieve measurable
2	progress in enhancing cooperation with Taiwan, in-
3	cluding through assessments in—
4	(A) development of strategies to engaging
5	Taiwan in the discussions of United States-
6	leading supply chain forums or dialogues; and
7	(B) economic and security benefits of in-
8	cluding Taiwan in the list of governments eligi-
9	ble for the strategic trade authorization excep-
10	tion.
11	(5) Any other matters the Secretary of Defense
12	determines relevant.
13	(c) FORM.—The report required under subsection (b)
14	shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may include
15	a classified annex.
16	(d) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term "appro-
17	priate congressional committees" means the congressional
18	defense committees and—
19	(1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the
20	Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House
21	of Representatives; and
22	(2) the Committee on Foreign Relations and
23	Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transpor-
24	tation of the Senate.

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
