## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 117–13 OFFERED BY MR. MALINOWSKI OF NEW JERSEY

Add at the end of subtitle C of title XIII of division A the following:

1	SEC. 13 REPORT AND DETERMINATION ON
2	EXTRAJUDICIAL KILLINGS AND TORTURE BY
3	EGYPTIAN GOVERNMENT SECURITY FORCES.
4	(a) In General.—Not later than 60 days after the
5	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State,
6	in consultation with the Secretary of Defense, shall submit
7	to the appropriate congressional committees a report on
8	incidents of state-sanctioned extrajudicial killings and tor-
9	ture by the security forces of the Government of Egypt.
10	(b) Matters to Be Included.—The report re-
11	quired under subsection (a) shall include the following:
12	(1) A detailed description of incidents of state-
13	sanctioned extrajudicial killings and torture by the
14	security forces of the Government of Egypt in the
15	seven years immediately preceding the submission of
16	such report.
17	(2) A determination of whether such incidents
18	constitute a consistent pattern of gross violations of
19	internationally recognized human rights.

1	(3) An identification of the unit names of any
2	Egyptian security forces added to the Department of
3	State-administered list of units to which security as-
4	sistance may not be furnished pursuant to any re-
5	ports containing credible information on
6	extrajudicial killings and torture, which reports were
7	received in the seven years immediately preceding
8	the submission of the report required under sub-
9	section (a).
10	(c) FORM.—The report required under subsection (a)
11	shall be submitted in unclassified form, but the portions
12	of the report described in paragraphs (2) and (3) may con-
13	tain a classified annex if such annex is provided separately
14	from such unclassified report.
15	(d) Appropriate Congressional Committees
16	DEFINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate con-
17	gressional committees" means the congressional defense
18	committees and—
19	(1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
20	House of Representatives; and
21	(2) the Committee on Foreign Relations of the
22	Senate.
