

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 861, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MRS. MALONEY OF NEW YORK**

Add at the end the following new section:

1 **SEC. 5. FINDINGS.**

2 The Congress finds the following:

3 (1) The Neighborhood Stabilization Program
4 funds have the potential to rehabilitate housing units
5 in all 50 states:

6 (A) There are 13369 homes in Alabama
7 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
8 could be eligible to receive funding under the
9 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

10 (B) There are 974 homes in Arkansas that
11 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
12 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
13 hood Stabilization Program.

14 (C) There are 52511 homes in Arizona
15 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
16 could be eligible to receive funding under the
17 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

18 (D) There are 92186 homes in California
19 that have been vacant 90 or more days and

1 could be eligible to receive funding under the
2 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

3 (E) There are 20671 homes in Colorado
4 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
5 could be eligible to receive funding under the
6 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

7 (F) There are 8501 homes in Connecticut
8 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
9 could be eligible to receive funding under the
10 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

11 (G) There are 224 homes in the District of
12 Columbia that have been vacant 90 or more
13 days and could be eligible to receive funding
14 under the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

15 (H) There are 549 homes in Delaware that
16 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
17 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
18 hood Stabilization Program.

19 (I) There are 203882 homes in Florida
20 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
21 could be eligible to receive funding under the
22 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

23 (J) There are 92950 homes in Georgia
24 that have been vacant 90 or more days and

1 could be eligible to receive funding under the
2 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

3 (K) There are 754 homes in Hawaii that
4 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
5 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
6 hood Stabilization Program.

7 (L) There are 2609 homes in Iowa that
8 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
9 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
10 hood Stabilization Program.

11 (M) There are 375 homes in Idaho that
12 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
13 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
14 hood Stabilization Program.

15 (N) There are 49043 homes in Illinois that
16 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
17 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
18 hood Stabilization Program.

19 (O) There are 74100 homes in Indiana
20 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
21 could be eligible to receive funding under the
22 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

23 (P) There are 2311 homes in Kansas that
24 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be

1 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
2 hood Stabilization Program.

3 (Q) There are 1191 homes in Kentucky
4 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
5 could be eligible to receive funding under the
6 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

7 (R) There are 2439 homes in Louisiana
8 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
9 could be eligible to receive funding under the
10 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

11 (S) There are 7331 homes in Massachu-
12 setts that have been vacant 90 or more days
13 and could be eligible to receive funding under
14 the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

15 (T) There are 1878 homes in Maryland
16 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
17 could be eligible to receive funding under the
18 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

19 (U) There are 167 homes in Maine that
20 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
21 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
22 hood Stabilization Program.

23 (V) There are 120365 homes in Michigan
24 that have been vacant 90 or more days and

1 could be eligible to receive funding under the
2 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

3 (W) There are 13937 homes in Minnesota
4 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
5 could be eligible to receive funding under the
6 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

7 (X) There are 20084 homes in Missouri
8 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
9 could be eligible to receive funding under the
10 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

11 (Y) There are 4431 homes in Mississippi
12 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
13 could be eligible to receive funding under the
14 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

15 (Z) There are 172 homes in Montana that
16 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
17 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
18 hood Stabilization Program.

19 (AA) There are 4510 homes in North
20 Carolina that have been vacant 90 or more days
21 and could be eligible to receive funding under
22 the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

23 (BB) There are 7 homes in North Dakota
24 that have been vacant 90 or more days and

1 could be eligible to receive funding under the
2 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

3 (CC) There are 2911 homes in Nebraska
4 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
5 could be eligible to receive funding under the
6 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

7 (DD) There are 155 homes in New Hamp-
8 shire that have been vacant 90 or more days
9 and could be eligible to receive funding under
10 the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

11 (EE) There are 10859 homes in New Jer-
12 sey that have been vacant 90 or more days and
13 could be eligible to receive funding under the
14 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

15 (FF) There are 41297 homes in Nevada
16 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
17 could be eligible to receive funding under the
18 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

19 (GG) There are 16422 homes in New York
20 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
21 could be eligible to receive funding under the
22 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

23 (HH) There are 116325 homes in Ohio
24 that have been vacant 90 or more days and

1 could be eligible to receive funding under the
2 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

3 (II) There are 2961 homes in Oklahoma
4 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
5 could be eligible to receive funding under the
6 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

7 (JJ) There are 32 homes in Oregon that
8 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
9 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
10 hood Stabilization Program.

11 (KK) There are 847 homes in Pennsyl-
12 vania that have been vacant 90 or more days
13 and could be eligible to receive funding under
14 the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

15 (LL) There are 3142 homes in Rhode Is-
16 land that have been vacant 90 or more days
17 and could be eligible to receive funding under
18 the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

19 (MM) There are 11172 homes in South
20 Carolina that have been vacant 90 or more days
21 and could be eligible to receive funding under
22 the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

23 (NN) There are 18141 homes in Ten-
24 nessee that have been vacant 90 or more days

1 and could be eligible to receive funding under
2 the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

3 (OO) There are 33982 homes in Texas
4 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
5 could be eligible to receive funding under the
6 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

7 (PP) There are 85 homes in Utah that
8 have been vacant 90 or more days and could be
9 eligible to receive funding under the Neighbor-
10 hood Stabilization Program.

11 (QQ) There are 5638 homes in Virginia
12 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
13 could be eligible to receive funding under the
14 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

15 (RR) There are 71 homes in Washington
16 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
17 could be eligible to receive funding under the
18 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

19 (SS) There are 5413 homes in Wisconsin
20 that have been vacant 90 or more days and
21 could be eligible to receive funding under the
22 Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

23 (2) Congress finds that by voting to terminate
24 the Neighborhood Stabilization Program these hous-

- 1 ing units may not be able to be rehabilitated and
- 2 may remain vacant.
