OFFERED BY MR. McCaul of Texas

Amend paragraph (10) of section 3(c) to read as follows:

(10) Roads.—

2	(A) In general.—The roads referred to
3	in paragraphs (3) and (4) shall include border
4	roads, patrol roads, access roads, and Federal,
5	State, local, and privately owned roads.
6	(B) Coordination.—In carrying out
7	paragraphs (3) and (4), the Secretary of Home-
8	land Security shall, as appropriate, coordinate
9	with the Secretary of Transportation, relevant
10	Federal, State, and local government agencies,
11	and owners of private roads.
	Add at the end of section 3(c) the following:
12	(12) Penalties.—
13	(A) IN GENERAL.—If the Secretary of
14	Homeland Security fails to meet any of the
15	deadlines required under paragraphs (1), (2),
16	(5), or (6), no political appointee of the Depart-

1	ment of Homeland Security may perform any
2	function described in subparagraph (B) until all
3	of such deadlines have been met.

In section 17(1)(B), in the matter proposed to be inserted in paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of section 2576a of title 10, United States Code, strike the period.

In section 20, transfer paragraph (7) to appear after paragraph (12) (and redesignate and correct cross-references accordingly).

In section 20, insert after the paragraph relating to the definition of "operational control" the following (and redesignate and correct cross-references accordingly):

- 3 () POLITICAL APPOINTEE.—The term "polit-
- 4 ical appointee" has the meaning given such term in
- 5 section 9803(c)(2) of title 5, United States Code.

At the end of the bill, add the following (and redesignate and correct cross-references accordingly):

6 SEC. 22. COORDINATION WITH THE FAA.

- 7 The Secretary of Homeland Security shall coordinate
- 8 with the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Adminis-
- 9 tration in carrying out requirements under this Act relat-
- 10 ing to the use of national airspace system.
