## AMENDMENT TO H.R. 4821, AS REPORTED OFFERED BY MR. MCCLINTOCK OF CALIFORNIA

At the end of the bill (before the short title), insert the following:

1 SEC. . (a) IN GENERAL.—With respect to cov-2 ered National Forest System lands, the Secretary of Agri-3 culture, acting through the Chief of the Forest Service— (1) shall— 4 5 (A) use all available resources to carry out 6 wildfire suppression with the purpose of extinguishing wildfires detected on such lands not 7 8 later than 24 hours after such a wildfire is de-9 tected; and 10 (B) immediately suppress any prescribed 11 fire that exceeds prescription; 12 (2) shall not inhibit the suppression efforts of 13 State or local firefighting agencies that are author-14 ized to respond to wildfire on such lands; 15 (3) may only use fire as a resource manage-16 ment tool if the fire is a prescribed fire that com-17 plies with applicable law and regulations; 18 (4) may only initiate a backfire or burnout dur-19 ing a wildfire2

1	(A) by order of the responsible incident
2	commander; or
3	(B) in instances that are necessary to pro-
4	tect the health and safety of firefighting per-
5	sonnel; and
6	(5) shall use all available resources to control
7	any such initiated backfire or burnout until extin-
8	guished.
9	(b) Covered National Forest System Lands
10	DEFINED.—In this section, the term "covered National
11	Forest System lands'' means any area—
12	(1) located within National Forest System
13	lands; and
14	(2) that—
15	(A) the U.S. Drought Monitor has rated as
16	having a D2 (severe drought) intensity, D3 (ex-
17	treme drought) intensity, or D4 (exceptional
18	drought) intensity;
19	(B) the National Interagency Fire Center
20	declares has a National Wildland Fire Pre-
21	paredness level of 5; or
22	(C) the Forest Service has identified as
23	being located in a fireshed ranked in the top 10
24	percent of wildfire exposure (as determined
25	using the most recently published models of

- 1 fireshed risk exposure published by the Forest
- 2 Service).
