

**AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 119-8**  
**OFFERED BY MR. MOOLENAAR OF MICHIGAN**

At the end of title XVII, add the following new sub-  
title:

1 **Subtitle \_\_\_\_\_—Tracking Hostile In-**  
2 **dustry Networks and Kit While**  
3 **Thwarting Weapons Imports**  
4 **From Chinese Entities Act of**

6 **SEC. 17\_\_\_\_. REPORT ON ARMS SALES OF THE PEOPLE’S RE-**  
7 **PUBLIC OF CHINA.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the  
9 date of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter,  
10 the Secretary of Defense, in coordination with the Sec-  
11 retary of State, shall submit to the appropriate congres-  
12 sional committees a report on arms sales facilitated by en-  
13 tities in the People’s Republic of China.

14 (b) CONTENTS.—The report required by subsection  
15 (a) shall include an analysis of—

16 (1) the weapons systems and defense equipment  
17 originating from the People’s Republic of China  
18 available for purchase;

1           (2) the technical aspects and capabilities of  
2       such weapons systems and defense equipment;

3           (3) how such weapons systems and defense  
4       equipment may impact the balance of power in the  
5       area of responsibility of each United States Combat-  
6       ant Command, when applicable;

7           (4) the weapons systems and defense equipment  
8       originating from the People's Republic of China that  
9       are considered direct alternatives to weapons sys-  
10      tems and defense equipment originating from the  
11      United States;

12          (5) the weapons systems and defense equipment  
13      originating from the People's Republic of China that  
14      present the greatest security risks regarding the po-  
15      tential to collect intelligence on or compromise as-  
16      sets, weapons, or platforms of the United States;

17          (6) the countries mostly likely to procure weap-  
18      ons systems and defense equipment originating from  
19      the People's Republic of China, including the specific  
20      type, quantity, and estimated value in United States  
21      dollars of weapons, during the 1-year period fol-  
22      lowing the date of the submission of the report;

23          (7) the weapons systems and defense equipment  
24      in development as of the date of the submission of  
25      the report by entities in the People's Republic of

1 China that could be available on the global market  
2 not later than 5 years after such date;

3 (8) the factors that incentivize countries to pro-  
4 cure such weapons systems and defense equipment,  
5 including costs, flexible payment conditions and fi-  
6 nancing, a lack of end-user agreements, and speed  
7 of sale and delivery; and

8 (9) the strategy of the People's Republic of  
9 China regarding arms sales and variables that could  
10 influence such strategy.

11 (c) FORM.—

12 (1) IN GENERAL.—The report required by sub-  
13 section (a) shall be submitted in unclassified form,  
14 but shall include a classified annex.

15 (2) CLASSIFIED ANNEX.—The classified annex  
16 required by paragraph (1) shall contain—

17 (A) an assessment by the National Intel-  
18 ligence Council of the contents required by sub-  
19 section (b); and

20 (B) an assessment by the Director of Na-  
21 tional Intelligence of the counterintelligence  
22 risks and risks of onward proliferation of tech-  
23 nology and defense systems originating in the  
24 United States and created through the pur-  
25 chase, deployment, and use of weapons systems

1 and defense equipment originating from the  
2 People's Republic of China by United States al-  
3 lies and partners.

4 (d) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES  
5 DEFINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate con-  
6 gressional committees” means—

7 (1) the Committee on Armed Services, the  
8 Committee on Foreign Relations, and the Select  
9 Committee on Intelligence of the Senate; and

10 (2) the Committee on Armed Services, the  
11 Committee on Foreign Affairs, and the Permanent  
12 Select Committee on Intelligence of the House of  
13 Representatives.

14 **SEC. 17\_\_\_\_. STRATEGY TO COMBAT ARMS SALES OF THE**  
15 **PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA.**

16 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the  
17 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State,  
18 in coordination with the Secretary of Defense, shall de-  
19 velop a strategy to dissuade purchases of new weapons  
20 systems and defense equipment, excluding spare parts or  
21 parts for maintenance of previously procured weapons,  
22 originating from the People's Republic of China.

23 (b) ELEMENTS.—The strategy shall include the fol-  
24 lowing elements:

1           (1) An information campaign targeting coun-  
2 tries interested in procuring weapons systems and  
3 defense equipment originating from the People's Re-  
4 public of China to warn such countries about—

5           (A) potential risks, including the lack of a  
6 proven track record in combat, insufficient  
7 training on the operation of the weapon or  
8 weapons system, reliability issues, and the lack  
9 of maintenance and spare parts available;

10           (B) the inability to integrate such weapons  
11 systems and defense equipment with weapons  
12 systems and defense equipment from the United  
13 States; and

14           (C) the potential limitation of future secu-  
15 rity cooperation with the United States that  
16 could arise if such weapons are acquired.

17           (2) A description of actions the United States  
18 can take, including reforms to the foreign military  
19 sales, direct commercial sales, and foreign military  
20 financing processes, to make weapons systems and  
21 defense equipment from the United States more at-  
22 tractive to prospective buyers of weapons systems or  
23 defense equipment originating from the People's Re-  
24 public of China.

1           (3) A description of actions defense firms of the  
2       United States can take to provide competitive alter-  
3       natives to prospective buyers of weapons systems  
4       and defense equipment originating from the People's  
5       Republic of China.

6           (4) An analysis of whether the use of sanctions,  
7       export controls, or other economic restrictions tar-  
8       geting buyers of new weapons systems or defense  
9       equipment originating from the People's Republic of  
10      China could serve as an effective deterrent.

11          (5) A plan to ensure sufficient representation of  
12      defense firms of the United States, or trusted allies,  
13      at defense expositions where defense firms of the  
14      People's Republic of China are also attending.

15          (6) A plan to combat Chinese disinformation  
16      campaigns targeting the performance of weapons or  
17      platforms produced by the United States or trusted  
18      allies.

19          (7) A plan to ensure close coordination with  
20      Congress to prevent disjointed engagement with  
21      countries.

22      (c) REPORT AND IMPLEMENTATION PLAN.—Not  
23      later than the date on which the strategy required by sub-  
24      section (a) is completed, the Secretary of State shall sub-

1 mit to the appropriate congressional committees a report  
2 detailing the strategy and a plan for implementation.

3 (d) FORM.—The report required by subsection (c)  
4 shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may include  
5 a classified annex.

6 (e) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-  
7 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congres-  
8 sional committees” means—

9 (1) the Committee on Armed Services and the  
10 Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate; and

11 (2) the Committee on Armed Services and the  
12 Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep-  
13 resentatives.
