1	SEC. 17 GRANTS TO IMPROVE MATERNAL AND CHILD
2	HEALTH OUTCOMES OF VICTIMS OF DOMES-
3	TIC VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE, SEXUAL
4	ASSAULT, STALKING, HUMAN TRAFFICKING,
5	SEX TRAFFICKING, CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE, OR
6	FORCED MARRIAGE.
7	(a) Grants.—The Secretary of Defense shall award
8	grants to eligible entities for developing and implementing
9	innovative approaches, including culturally relevant edu-
10	cation campaigns, to improve maternal and child health
11	outcomes of victims of domestic violence, dating violence,
12	sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking, sex traf-
13	ficking, child sexual abuse, or forced marriage.
14	(b) Eligible Entities.—To be eligible to seek a
15	grant under this section, an entity shall be—
16	(1) a State, local, or federally-recognized Tribal
17	government;
18	(2) a nonprofit organization or community-
19	based organization that provides prevention or inter-

1	vention services related to domestic violence, dating
2	violence, sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking,
3	sex trafficking, child sexual abuse, or forced mar-
4	riage;
5	(3) a Tribe, Tribal organization, or Urban In-
6	dian organization (as such terms are defined in sec-
7	tion 4 of the Indian Health Care Improvement Act
8	(25 U.S.C. 1603));
9	(4) a Tribal epidemiology center;
10	(5) a Federally qualified health center;
11	(6) a certified community behavioral health cen-
12	ter;
13	(7) an entity, the principal purpose of which is
14	to provide health care;
15	(8) an institution of higher education; or
16	(9) a comprehensive substance use disorder par-
17	enting program.
18	(e) Priority in Awarding Grants.—In awarding
19	grants under this section, the Secretary of Defense shall
20	give priority—
21	(1) to applicants proposing—
22	(A) to address domestic violence, dating vi-
23	olence, mental health, and substance use dis-
24	orders among pregnant persons;

1	(B) to support people experiencing domes-
2	tic violence who are pregnant, persons at risk
3	for becoming pregnant due to violence or abuse,
4	and postpartum persons experiencing violence;
5	(C) to provide cultural bias training, anti-
6	racism training, or implicit bias interruption or
7	reduction strategies, and strategies to identify
8	and prevent domestic violence within all racial,
9	cultural, ethnic, and community groups, includ-
10	ing Black and African American, Hispanic and
11	Latino, American Indian, Native Hawaiian, Pa-
12	cific Islander, Alaskan Native, and
13	LGBTQIA2S+ persons;
14	(D) to implement innovations around the
15	improvement of maternal health surveillance; or
16	(E) to facilitate shared learning and dis-
17	semination of information through convenings
18	with other grantees under this section; and
19	(2) to applicants that are Tribal epidemiology
20	centers.
21	(d) Report to Congress.—Not later than 3 years
22	after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of
23	Defense shall submit a report to the Congress on the grant
24	program under this section, including the results of the

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- 1 innovative approaches implemented by the grant recipi-
