At the end of the bill, add the following:

## 1 TITLE III—BUMP STOCKS

2 SEC. 301. PROHIBITION ON MANUFACTURE, POSSESSION,
3 OR TRANSFER OF ANY PART OR COMBINA4 TION OF PARTS THAT IS DESIGNED AND
5 FUNCTIONS TO INCREASE THE RATE OF FIRE
6 OF A SEMIAUTOMATIC RIFLE BUT DOES NOT
7 CONVERT THE SEMIAUTOMATIC RIFLE INTO
8 A MACHINEGUN.

9 (a) PROHIBITION.—Section 922 of title 18, United
10 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol11 lowing:

12 "(aa) It shall be unlawful for any person—

13 "(1) in or affecting interstate or foreign com-14 merce, to manufacture, possess, or transfer any part 15 or combination of parts that is designed and func-16 tions to increase the rate of fire of a semiautomatic 17 rifle but does not convert the semiautomatic rifle 18 into a machinegun; or "(2) to manufacture, possess, or transfer any
 such part or combination of parts that have been
 shipped or transported in interstate or foreign com merce.".

5 (b) PENALTIES.—Section 924(a)(1)(B) of such title
6 is amended by striking "or (q)" and inserting "(q), or
7 (aa)".

8 (c) SENTENCING GUIDELINES.—Pursuant to its au-9 thority under section 994 of title 28, United States Code, 10 and in accordance with this subsection, the United States 11 Sentencing Commission shall amend and review the Fed-12 eral sentencing guidelines and policy statements to ensure that the guidelines provide for a penalty enhancement of 13 not less than 2 offense levels for a violation of section 14 15 922(aa) of title 18 of such Code if the device described in such section 922(aa) has been— 16

(1) used, carried, or possessed during or in relation to a crime of violence or drug trafficking
crime (as such terms are defined in section
924(c)(3) of such title 18); or

21 (2) smuggled unlawfully into or from the22 United States.

23 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section and the amend-24 ments made by this section shall apply with respect to con-

- 1 duct engaged in after the 90-day period that begins with
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.
