## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118– 36

## OFFERED BY MR. MOYLAN OF GUAM

At the end of subtitle F of title V, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 5 ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFENSE OF HUMAN TRAF-
2	FICKING UNDER THE UNIFORM CODE OF
3	MILITARY JUSTICE.
4	(a) In General.—The Secretary of Defense, in con-
5	sultation with the Secretaries of the military departments
6	and the Secretary of Homeland Security, shall establish
7	the offense of human trafficking as a standalone offense
8	punishable under section 934 of title 10, United States
9	Code (article 134 of the Uniform Code of Military Jus-
10	tice).
11	(b) Development and Implementation.—For
12	purposes of subsection (a), the Secretary of Defense, in
13	consultation with the Secretaries of the military depart-
14	ments and the Secretary of Homeland Security, shall—
15	(1) develop a definition human trafficking;
16	(2) establish the elements of the offense of
17	human trafficking;

1	(3) prescribe a range of punishments for indi-
2	viduals found guilty of such offense; and
3	(4) ensure that individuals subject to chapter
4	47 of title 10, United States Code (the Uniform
5	Code of Military Justice), receive adequate notice re-
6	garding such offense.
7	(c) Annual Reports.—Not later than April 1,
8	2025, an on an annual basis thereafter, the Secretary of
9	Defense shall submit to the congressional defense commit-
10	tees a report on the status of the implementation of this
11	section. Such report shall include—
12	(1) a description of offense of human traf-
13	ficking as established under subsection (a);
14	(2) a description of the punishments authorized
15	for such offense;
16	(3) a description any legislation or other actions
17	that may be needed to effectively implement such of-
18	fense; and
19	(4) any other information the Secretary deter-
20	mines relevant.
